Justification:

This budget change for the Brevard County Sheriff's Office amends to budget in order to recognize and appropriate grant funds and other revenue. The Task Force, Homeland Security, Office of the Attorney General, and private grants (\$1.24M) will be used for overtime, operating, and capital expenditures associated with each program. The Homeland Port Security Grant award (\$274K) will be used for purchase of dive equipment, supplies, and the refurbishment of the 29' Safeboat. The FY24 State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP), FY23 Byrne Transportation, and Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) Criminal Justice Data Transparency (CJDT) grants (\$217K) will be used as follows: SCAAP funds to purchase equipment at the jail; Byrne Transportation funds supplement salary and benefits of deputies transporting inmates within the county; FDLE CJDT funds will be used in the sustainment of software necessary at the jail. Funds received from Workers Compensation reimbursement and Nonprofit reimbursements (\$21K) will be used to offset costs associated with each program.

DOH-Brevard Issues Mosquito-Borne Illness Alert

Brevard, Fla.—The Florida Department of Health in Brevard County (DOH-Brevard) is informing residents of four confirmed cases of locally-acquired dengue. DOH-Brevard and Brevard County Mosquito Control are coordinating surveillance and prevention efforts by enhanced monitoring for mosquitoes and diseases as well as targeted mosquito treatment and overnight spraying to reduce the risk of disease transmission.

Dengue can present as a flu-like illness with severe muscle aches and joint pain, fever, and sometimes a rash. Usually, there are no respiratory symptoms. Symptoms of dengue will appear within 15 days after being bitten by an infected mosquito. Dengue fever is not contagious but is transmitted by the bite of an infected *Aedes aegypti* mosquito.

DOH-Brevard reminds the community to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes by taking these basic precautions.

The Department continues to conduct statewide surveillance for mosquito-borne illnesses, including West Nile virus infections, Eastern equine encephalitis, St. Louis encephalitis, malaria, chikungunya, and dengue. Residents of Florida are encouraged to report dead birds to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's site.
