SUBJECT:	Extension of Inter-local Agreement with the City of Palm Bay Re: Bus/Transit Shelters and Benches – Districts III & V
DEPT/OFFICE:	Transit Services Department/Space Coast Area Transit

Requested Action:

It is requested that the Board of County Commissioners approve and authorize the Chairman to sign an Agreement to Extend Existing Agreement between the City of Palm Bay and Space Coast Area Transit for the purpose of providing Bus/Transit Shelters and Benches within the Palm Bay City limits.

Summary Explanation & Background:

On March 8, 2011, the Board of County Commissioners approved an Inter-local Agreement with the City of Palm Bay for the purpose of providing bus shelters and benches throughout the city limits. The current agreement is scheduled to expire on March 31, 2016. The City of Palm Bay is requesting a two year extension to the existing agreement in order to provide sufficient time to complete pending items, such as:

6 benches and 4 shelters, already programmed
6 new shelters (2 newly requested on Babcock St)

This extension of time will also assist staff in coordinating some of the ADA accommodations as outlined in the recent Space Coast Area Transit ADA Bus Stop Assessment Plan.

There is no fiscal impact as a result of this action as the six new shelters are included in the original agreement and funding in an amount up to \$39,000 has been programmed in existing Federal Transit Administration Capital Grants.



**BUS/TRANSIT SHELTER AND BENCH
INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT**

This Interlocal Agreement is entered into this 8 day of March, 2011, by and between the **BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA**, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "County", and the **CITY OF PALM BAY, FLORIDA**, a Florida Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "City".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County has the authority to provide written authorization to a qualified entity for installing and operating TRANSIT SHELTERS or BENCHES for the comfort and convenience to the general public, or at designated stops on official bus routes pursuant to Section 337.408, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to enter into an Agreement with the City to install and maintain TRANSIT SHELTERS and BENCHES; and

WHEREAS, the City has secured property and locations for TRANSIT SHELTERS or BENCHES for use within the City of Palm Bay in compliance with rules set forth in Florida Administrative Code 14-20; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement was approved with authority of the Chairman to execute the same by the Board of County Commissioners of Brevard County, Florida at a meeting, on this 8th day of March, 2011; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement was approved by the Palm Bay City Council at a duly called meeting on the 3RD day of FEBRUARY, 2011.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants herein contained, it is mutually agreed between the parties as follows:

SECTION 1. PURCHASING AND LOCATION: By not later than 12/31/11, 2011, the County hereby agrees to provide TRANSIT SHELTERS and/or BENCHES at specifically agreed upon and designated stops on official bus routes within the City as identified in Attachment "A", attached hereto, as funding permits. The modification, addition or removal of any agreed upon TRANSIT SHELTER or BENCH location is permitted subject to written agreement of the County's Transit Director and the City Manager. Purchasing of these TRANSIT SHELTERS and BENCHES by the County (Space Coast Area Transit) will be in accordance with Federal Grant and County purchasing guidelines.

SECTION 2. SHELTER/BENCH DESIGN AND MAINTENANCE: The size, shape, and configuration and specific location of each and every TRANSIT Shelter and Bench shall be subject to approval by the County. The design of each TRANSIT SHELTER and BENCH will be based upon mutually agreed upon requirements and specifications identified by the County and City. Design, plans and specifications for and erection of each TRANSIT Shelter and BENCH shall be in accordance with provisions outlined under Chapter 14-20, *Florida Administrative Code (FAC)* and Sections 337.408 and 337.409, of the *Florida Statutes*. Except as provided in Section 7

hereof, the City agrees to provide general cleaning, maintenance and trash removal for the TRANSIT SHELTERS and BENCHES, including labor costs associated with repair of items located in or on the TRANSIT SHELTER and BENCH. The County agrees to provide repair parts and materials to the City for necessary repairs to TRANSIT SHELTERS and BENCHES.

SECTION 3. SHELTER/BENCHES INSTALLATION: The City agrees to provide the installation of the TRANSIT SHELTERS and BENCHES and to comply with all applicable state, federal, and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations in the construction, erection, installation and maintenance of the TRANSIT SHELTERS and BENCHES, including without limitation, permitting. Installation is inclusive of all site planning, the pouring of concrete or pavement slabs for the purpose of providing a foundation for the TRANSIT SHELTERS and BENCHES and construction of the TRANSIT SHELTER and BENCHES, in accordance with the shelter vendor's installation specifications. The City will invoice the County (Space Coast Area Transit) for appropriate costs associated with these actions in accordance with price estimates established for each TRANSIT SHELTER and BENCH location, as identified in Attachment "B", attached hereto. Said price estimates are approximations of cost only and shall not provide binding amounts; provided, that in no event shall the total cost for installation sought to be reimbursed exceed by thirty percent (30%) the total estimated cost for installation. The County shall remit payment in accordance with the Florida Prompt Payment Act, Section 218.70, Florida Statutes, et seq.

SECTION 4. TERM AND USE: Each and every TRANSIT SHELTER and BENCH installed and operated under this Agreement within the City shall be available to use by the general public on a gratis basis; provided, that the City may install devices that restrict sleeping in or on shelters, preclude the use of shelters by the general public during certain hours of the day, number of times per day, or when the shelters are in need of or under repair. The term of this Agreement is for a period of five (5) years, terminating on March 31, 2016, unless otherwise extended.

SECTION 5. TERMINATION: Either party may terminate this Agreement for any reason upon at least sixty (60) days prior written notice. In the event of termination, the County (Space Coast Area Transit) will be responsible for the costs associated with the removal of the TRANSIT SHELTER structure and BENCHES. If deemed necessary by the City and agreed upon by both parties that the concrete pad or electrical connections or pavement must be removed, the costs associated with removal of the TRANSIT SHELTER concrete pad or pavement and electrical connection will be equally shared between the City and County. In the event the designated bus stop where the TRANSIT SHELTER or BENCH is located is eliminated as part of the official bus route, or if the Department of Transportation mandates removal, the TRANSIT SHELTER or BENCH, including the concrete pad, electrical connections and pavement, shall be removed by the County (Space Coast Area Transit), and any costs directly related to said removal shall be the responsibility of the County.

SECTION 6. SIGNAGE: Signs, messages, and advertising in any form shall be prohibited on all TRANSIT SHELTERS and BENCHES, unless otherwise authorized by this Agreement or the City Code. However, even if otherwise authorized, said signs, messages, and advertising shall be approved by both the County Manager and City Manager. It is mutually agreed upon by the City and County that the display cases located on the TRANSIT SHELTERS will not be utilized for paid or sponsored advertisement, but for public service message material, as mutually authorized by both parties. Messages on TRANSIT SHELTERS shall not exceed 18" in size, 2 in number, and shall not be placed or created in such a way as to distract motor vehicular. There shall be no advertising on BENCHES.

SECTION 7. UTILITIES: The City agrees to pay all reasonable charges for the electrical utility lighting costs for the TRANSIT SHELTERS listed in Attachment "A", and any future mutually agreed upon TRANSIT SHELTER.

SECTION 8. DAMAGE: The County agrees to repair, replace, and/or reimburse the City for any and all damages caused to property and equipment owned by the City and resulting primarily from the action of County employees. The County shall cause such repair, replacement and/or reimbursement to occur within a reasonable amount of time thereby affording no undue hardship to the City.

The City agrees to repair, replace, and/or reimburse the County for any and all damages caused to property and equipment owned by the County and resulting primarily from the action of City employees. The City shall cause such repair, replacement and/or reimbursement to occur within a reasonable amount of time thereby affording no undue hardship to the County.

SECTION 9. ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COSTS: In the event of any litigation between the parties arising out of this Agreement, each party will bear its own attorney's fees and costs.

SECTION 10. SEVERABILITY: If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Agreement is, for any reason held by a Court to be unconstitutional, inoperative, or void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of this Agreement.

SECTION 11. HOLD HARMLESS/INDEMNIFICATION: The City, to the extent permitted by law, agrees to fully indemnify, defend, and hold the County, its officers, agents, and employees harmless against any claims for bodily injury, sickness, disease death or personal injury, or damage to property or loss of use resulting there from, including attorneys fees and court costs, arising out of this Agreement, or any services provided by the City pursuant to this Agreement, if such claims are as a result of the City's sole negligence.

The County, to the extent permitted by law, agrees to fully indemnify, defend, and hold the City, its officers, agents, and employees harmless against any claims for bodily

injury, sickness, disease death or personal injury, or damage to property or loss of use resulting there from, including attorneys fees and court costs, arising out of this Agreement, or any services provided by the County pursuant to this Agreement, if such claims are as a result of the County's sole negligence.

In agreeing to this provision neither party intends to waive any defense or limited of sovereign immunity to which it may be entitled under Section 768.28, Florida Statutes or otherwise provided. The parties acknowledge specific consideration has been exchanged for this hold harmless/indemnification provision.

SECTION 12. EFFECTIVE DATE: This Agreement shall be effective upon signing of both parties.

SECTION 13. JURISDICTION, VENUE, AND CHOICE OF LAW: All questions pertaining to the validity and interpretations of this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with the Laws of the State of Florida. Any legal action by either party against the other concerning the Agreement shall be filed in a court of competent jurisdiction in and for Brevard County, Florida, and any trial shall be non-jury.

SECTION 14. AUDITING, RECORDS AND INSPECTIONS: In the performance of this Agreement, the City and County shall keep books, records and account of all activities related to this Agreement, in compliance with generally accepted accounting procedures. Books, records, and accounts related to the performance of this Agreement shall be open to inspection during regular business hours by authorized representatives of both entities for a period of three (3) years after termination of this Agreement. All books, records, and accounts related to the performance of this Agreement shall be subject to the applicable provisions of the Florida Public Records Act, Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

SECTION 15. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR: The City and County are independent contractors under this Agreement. Service provided by City pursuant to this Agreement shall be subject to the supervision of City and services provided by County pursuant to this Agreement shall be subject to the supervision of City. In providing such services, the City, its officers, employees, or agents are not authorized to and shall not act as officers, employees or agents of the County and the County, its officers, employees or agents are not authorized to and shall not act as officers, employees, or agents of the City. This Agreement shall not constitute or make the parties hereto a partnership or joint venture.

SECTION 16. ASSIGNMENT: Neither this Agreement nor any interest herein shall be assigned, transferred, or encumbered by either party without the written consent of the other party.

SECTION 17. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This Agreement, including any attachments attached hereto, sets forth the entire Agreement between the parties. This Agreement shall not be modified except in writing and executed by all parties. This

Agreement was negotiated by both parties hereto. Consequently, no provision shall be more harshly interpreted against either party hereto as drafter of this Agreement.





THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 12 day of August 2014 by and between the **BOARD OF COUNTY COMISSIONERS OF BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA**, a political subdivisions of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "County", and the **CITY OF PALM BAY, FLORIDA**, a Florida Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "City".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have previously entered into Agreement on March 8, 2011 and;

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have agreed to revise Attachment "A" Possible TRANSIT SHELTER and BENCH Locations, as authorized in Section 1, and;

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have agreed to revise Attachment "B" TRANSIT SHELTER and BENCH Cost Estimates, as authorized in Sections 1 and 2, and;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants herein contained, the parties hereby agree, as follows:

1. Attachment "A" has been revised to modify and/or remove previously agreed upon Transit Shelter and Bench locations, and to add additional Transit Shelter and Bench locations, renamed as Attachment "A & B".
2. Attachment "B" has been revised to include updated design and construction costs for Transit Shelter and Bench locations to more closely reflect the City's current design and construction costs. A table has been added to reflect the maximum reimbursable amount for each location reflected on the revised Attachment "B", renamed as Attachment "A & B".
3. Routes have been changed since effective date of the Agreement; therefore, Attachment "A", now renamed as Attachment "A & B", reflects the list of Transit Shelter and Bench locations on routes depicted on Attachment "C".
4. All costs incurred for site locations reflected on the original Attachment "A" in which the County modified, eliminated, or relocated shall be reimbursed to the City. These costs shall not exceed the maximum reimbursable expenses reflected in the revised Attachment "A & B".
5. All costs incurred for site locations reflected on the revised Attachment "A & B" in which the County modifies, eliminates, or relocates in the future shall be reimbursed to the City. These costs shall not exceed the maximum reimbursable expenses reflected in the revised Attachment "A & B".

6. The Palm Bay Hospital Shelter location is to be maintained by the site owner or others, not the City.
7. The City shall design and construct a concrete foundation at the Walmart located at 1040 Malabar Road SE, Palm Bay, FL and Walmart shall obtain the appropriate permits and erect the vertical portion of the Shelter.
8. The County will reduce the reimbursable amount to the City when other funding sources, such as the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), are used for design and/or construction for locations reflected on the revised Attachment "A & B".
9. All terms and conditions of the previous Agreement, Contract #160, which is incorporated herein by this reference, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Agreement, shall remain in full force and effect.
