

### Subject:

Certification of Local Option Gas Tax (LOGT) Percentages Allocations

### **Fiscal Impact:**

For FY 2025-2026, Brevard County will receive 47.14% of the local option gas tax revenue.

### Dept/Office:

### **Requested Action:**

It is requested the Board of County Commissioners certify the revenue percentage allocations and authorize the Clerk's Finance Department to submit the allocations to the Florida Department of Revenue (DOR).

### **Summary Explanation and Background:**

On May 6, 2025, the Board of County Commissioners reviewed the preliminary revenue percentage allocations and authorized the Clerk to send them to each municipality for review. The Board is required to certify the revenue allocations and authorize the Clerk's Finance Department to submit the allocations for the Florida Department of Revenue (DOR) to establish the allocations for the upcoming year.

The attached materials show the updated population and expenditure figures in accordance with the formula in the Interlocal Agreement. According to the 1988 Interlocal Agreement, the County's minimum revenue share is 47.14% beginning in 1991. The remaining, non-county revenue share (52.68% of the total); will be proportionally allocated among the municipalities according to the relative population and previous five-year transportation expenditures for each municipality.

### Good afternoon Andrew,

Thank you so much for taking the time to speak with me today. The deadline for remitting information to the department is 60 days prior to the effective date. Since Brevard county's effective date is September 1<sup>st</sup>, the deadline for remitting information is July 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. I understand that the board does not meet in June, therefore this should be a topic that is brought to meeting prior to June of each year. The Department has provided grace periods in the past, but the county should prepare for next year to be able to meet the deadline.

Ordinance 2005-51 for the regular local option gas tax expires 08/31/2026. The department is able to occasionally grant grace periods for percentages, but if the county does not meet the July 1, 2026 deadline for the re-levy of this tax, an extension cannot be granted for a statutory levy of tax. Recently a county was not able to call an emergency meeting to re-levy the tax and was unable to meet the July 1<sup>st</sup> deadline which resulted in the lapse of tax and millions in Revenue lost to the county until the re-levy could occur with a January 1<sup>st</sup> effective date.

Due to the upcoming expiration of the tax and the timing of when the board can meet on the topic, the county may choose draw a new ordinance to re-levy the tax as of January 1,2026 by rescinding the remaining months of ordinance 2005-51 and re-levying the tax according to 336.025. Should the county choose to rescind the remaining months and re-levy the tax effective January 1, 2026 - December 31, 2055, the due date for the fully executed ordinance and interlocal (distribution percentages) moving forward would be October 1, 2025 and October 1 of every year afterwards for the percentages, allowing for the board to meet in July concerning the redistribution of gas tax.

If the county does not meet the October 1 deadline of this year, the tax may be re-levied and due to the Department by July 1, 2026 with an effective date of September 1, 2026 – December 31, 2055 per 336.025(1)(a)1 and 336.025(5)(a).

336.025(1)(a)1. All impositions and rate changes of the tax shall be levied before October 1 to be effective January 1 of the following year for a period not to exceed 30 years, and the applicable method of distribution shall be established pursuant to subsection (3) or subsection (4). However, levies of the tax which were in effect on July 1, 2002, and which expire on August 31 of any year may be reimposed at the current authorized rate provided the tax is levied before July 1 and is effective September 1 of the year of expiration. Upon expiration, the tax may be re-levied provided that a redetermination of the method of distribution is made as provided in this section.

336.025(5)(a) By October 1 of each year, the county shall notify the Department of Revenue of the rate of the taxes levied pursuant to paragraphs (1)(a) and (b), and of its decision to rescind or change the rate of a tax, if applicable, and shall provide the department with a certified copy of the interlocal agreement established under subparagraph (1)(b)2. or subparagraph (3)(a)1. with distribution proportions established by such agreement or pursuant to subsection (4), if applicable. A decision to rescind a tax may not take effect on any date other than December 31, regardless of when the tax was originally imposed, and requires a minimum of 60 days' notice to the Department of Revenue of such decision.
