Requested Action:

The Economic Development Commission of Florida's Space Coast requests the Board of County Commissioners adopt a Resolution amending the guidelines for the Brevard County Ad Valorem Tax Abatement Program as recommended by the Economic Development Commission of Florida's Space Coast's Ad Valorem Tax Abatement Council.

Summary Explanation and Background:

The Ad Valorem Tax Abatement (AVT) Council of the Economic Development Commission of Florida's Space Coast is recommending to revise the Brevard County Ad Valorem Tax Abatement program guidelines to reflect the 2022 Brevard County average annual wage of \$61,784 that was effective on January 1, 2024, as published by FloridaCommerce (formerly known as Enterprise Florida) - sourced by Florida Department of Commerce, Labor Market Statistics Center, Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages Program, in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

This average wage (\$61,784) would replace the current average wage (\$57,927) in the Brevard County Ad Valorem Tax Abatement program guidelines.

RESOLUTION 2024 .- 041

WHEREAS, Economic Development Ad Valorem Tax Exemption of Brevard County, Florida was adopted as a result of a referendum held on November 4, 2014, where the voters authorized the County Commission grant economic development and ad valorem tax exemptions; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners to provide incentives to those new or expanded businesses which result in an economic benefit to the County; and

WHEREAS, the Economic Development Ad Valorem Tax Exemption Ordinance establishes the degree and length of exemptions based on guidelines adopted by Resolution of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission adopted changes to the guidelines at its August 22, 2023 regularly held County Commission meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Economic Development Commission of Florida's Space Coast has recommended select changes to the program guidelines specific to the average annual wage criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA as follows:

Brevard County Ad Valorem Tax Abatement Program guidelines are amended to adopt the 2022 average annual Brevard County wage of \$61,784 which was effective on January 1, 2024 and specified herein in the attached schedule.

A certified copy of this Resolution shall be filed with the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of Brevard County, Florida and shall constitute a public record.

This resolution shall take effect on May 7, 2024.
