





Is Roadside Trash “Mulchable”?



- The majority of visible roadside trash is composed of:
 - Bottles, plastic bottles, plastic cups
 - Styrofoam cups, plates, plastic bags
 - Aluminum cans, Fast-food trash
 - Larger items, and other
- Contrary to popular belief, “mulching” aluminum cans into sharp scrap metal, smashing glass bottles, shredding plastic bags & bottles, --is not mulching.

A: You tell me.








