Subject:

Approval, Re: Emergency Rental Assistance Payment funds from the United States Department of the Treasury (estimated \$18,034,939).

Fiscal Impact:

FY20-21: There will be no impact to the General Fund. A separate Cost Center will be created to recognize and budget all Emergency Rental Assistance Payment funds (currently estimated at \$18,034,939).

FY21-22: There will be no impact to the General Fund.

Dept/Office:

Housing and Human Services Department

Requested Action:

It is requested that the Board of County Commissioners authorize: (1) the County Manager to execute the grant award terms for Emergency Rental Assistance through the United States Department of the Treasury; (2) the Director of Housing and Human Services to complete the electronic submission of the grant award terms including financial institution details; (3) the Housing and Human Services Department as the agency to be responsible for the administration, oversight, implementation, and monitoring of the Emergency Rental Assistance program; (4) the County Manager or designee to execute future Interlocal Agreements, contracts, amendments, and/or modifications related to Emergency Rental Assistance upon approval of Risk Management and the County Attorney's Office; (5) the County Manager to approve all related budget change requests.

Summary Explanation and Background:

The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 was signed into law by President Trump on December 27, 2020. Included in the \$2.3 trillion bill was an additional \$900 billion in stimulus relief for the COVID-19 pandemic. The new stimulus included an allocation of \$25 billion for rental payment assistance. Under the legislation, counties with populations above 200,000 residents are eligible to receive direct payments from the United States Department of the Treasury (Treasury). Per the National Association of Counties, Brevard County is estimated to receive \$18,034,939 (Treasury has not provided final funding allocations).

On January 6, 2021, Brevard County received the grantee award terms which are to be signed by the Chief Executive Officer (see attached). An executed copy of the award terms is required to be returned to Treasury no later than 11:59 p.m. EDT on January 12, 2021.

 Use of Funds. Recipient understands and agrees that the funds disbursed under this award may only be used for the purposes set forth in Section 501 of Division N of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, Pub. L. No. 116-260 (Dec. 27, 2020) (referred to herein as "Section 501").

Repayment and reallocation of funds.

- a. Recipient agrees to repay excess funds to Treasury in the amount as may be determined by Treasury pursuant to Section 501(d). Such repayment shall be made in the manner and by the date, which shall be no sooner than September 30, 2021, as may be set by Treasury.
- b. The reallocation of funds provided by Section 501(d) shall be determined by Treasury and shall be subject to the availability of funds at such time.

Availability of funds.

- a. Recipient acknowledges that, pursuant to Section 501(e), funds provided under this award shall remain available only through December 31, 2021, unless, in the case of a reallocation made by Treasury pursuant to section 501(d), Recipient requests and receives from Treasury an extension of up to 90 days.
- b. Any such requests for extension shall be provided in the form and shall include such information as Treasury may require.
- c. Amounts not expended by Recipient in accordance with Section 501 shall be repaid to Treasury in the manner specified by Treasury.

4. Administrative costs.

- a. Administrative expenses of Recipient may be treated as direct costs, but Recipient may not cover indirect costs using the funds provided in this award, and Recipient may not apply its negotiated indirect cost rate to this award.
- b. The sum of the amount of the award expended on housing stability services described in Section 501(c)(3) and the amount of the award expended on administrative expenses described in Section 501(c)(5) may not exceed 10 percent of the total award.

5. Reporting.

- a. Recipient agrees to comply with any reporting obligations established by Treasury, including the Treasury Office of Inspector General, as relates to this award, including but not limited to: (i) reporting of information to be used by Treasury to comply with its public reporting obligations under section 501(g) and (ii) any reporting to Treasury and the Pandemic Response Accountability Committee that may be required pursuant to section 15011(b)(2) of Division B of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (Pub. L. No. 116-136), as amended by Section 801 of Division O of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (Pub. L. No. 116-260). Recipient acknowledges that any such information required to be reported pursuant to this section may be publicly disclosed.
- b. Recipient agrees to establish data privacy and security requirements as required by Section 501(g)(4).

6. Maintenance of and Access to Records

- a. Recipient shall maintain records and financial documents sufficient to support compliance with Section 501(c) regarding the eligible uses of funds.
- b. The Treasury Office of Inspector General and the Government Accountability Office, or their authorized representatives, shall have the right of access to records (electronic and otherwise) of Recipient in order to conduct audits or other investigations.
- c. Records shall be maintained by Recipient for a period of five (5) years after all funds have been expended or returned to Treasury.
- 7. Cost Sharing. Cost sharing or matching funds are not required to be provided by Recipient.

8. Compliance with Applicable Law and Regulations.

- a. Recipient agrees to comply with the requirements of Section 501 and Treasury interpretive guidance regarding such requirements. Recipient also agrees to comply with all other applicable federal etatutes, regulations, and executive orders, and Recipient shall provide for such compliance in any agreements it enters into with other parties relating to this award.
- b. Federal regulations applicable to this award include, without limitation, the following:
 - i. Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awarde, 2 C.F.R. Part 200, other than such provisions as Treasury may determine are inapplicable to this Award and subject to such exceptions as may be otherwise provided by Treasury. Subpart F – Audit Requirements of the Uniform Guidance, implementing the Single Audit Act, shall apply to this award.
 - Universal Identifier and System for Award Management (SAM), 2 C.F.R. Part 25 and pursuant to which the award term set forth in Appendix A to 2 C.F.R. Part 25 is hereby incorporated by reference.
 - iii. Reporting Subaward and Executive Compensation Information, 2 C.F.R. Part 170, pursuant to which the award term set forth in Appendix A to 2 C.F.R. Part 170 is hereby incorporated by reference.

12. Disclaimer.

- a. The United States expressly disclaims any and all responsibility or liability to Recipient or third persons for the actions of Recipient or third persons resulting in death, bodily injury, property damages, or any other losses resulting in any way from the performance of this award or any other losses resulting in any way from the performance of this award or any contract, or subcontract under this award.
- b. The acceptance of this award by Recipient does not in any way constitute an agency relationship between the United States and Recipient.

19. Protections for Whistleblowers.

- a.
