RESOLUTION NO. 16PZ00107

On motion by Commissioner Isnardi, seconded by Commissioner Barfield, the following resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote:

WHEREAS, ROBERT C. & MARION L. BAUMAN have requested a change of classification from RR-1 (Rural Residential) and RU-1-7 (Single-Family Residential) to all RU-1-7, on property described as Lots 12, 13, & 14, Block 31, June Park, according to the plat thereof, as recorded in Plat Book 4 of the Public Records of Brevard County, Florida; and Lots 15 – 33, Block 31, June Park Subdivision, as recorded in Plat Book 4, Page 4, of the Public Records of Brevard County, Florida. (1.52 acres) Located on the east side of Washington St., approx. 0.17 mile south of Milwaukee Ave. (Lot 12 = No assigned address. In the Melbourne area. Lot 15 = 2685 Washington St. Melbourne.)

Section 12, Township 28S, Range 36E, and,



BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Brevard County, Florida, that the requested change of classification from RR-1 and RU-1-7 to all RU-1-7, be APPROVED, and that the zoning classification relating to the above described property be changed to RU-1-11, and the Planning & Development Director, or designee, is hereby directed to make this change on the official zoning maps of Brevard County, Florida.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall become effective as of February 2, 2017.

(P&Z Hearing – January 9, 2017)
