## Summary of Impacts and Actions

### Overview

Multiple neighborhoods are experiencing a growing and unmanaged peacock population extending beyond HOA boundaries.

### Actions Taken

HOA notices, removal of food sources, deterrents, tree trimming, and guidance from FWC have been followed. FWC and BCSO have been contacted and advised this falls outside their scope.

### Impacts

Noise disturbances (2–5 AM), sleep disruption, property damage, sanitation concerns, and safety risks involving traffic and pedestrians.

### Challenges

Feeding continues in non-HOA areas. HOA cannot allocate funds without 75% vote.

### Request

Request County evaluation and consideration of hiring a licensed wildlife trapper.

### Precedent

Nearby Cocoa Beach addressed a similar issue by hiring a licensed wildlife trapper.

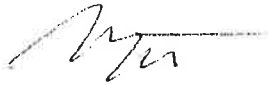
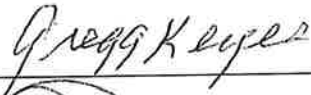
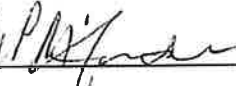

Commissioner Goodson,

I am a resident of Merritt Island (32952) writing to request assistance regarding a growing public nuisance involving a large population of free-roaming peafowl in our area.

There are currently an estimated 40–50 peafowl roosting nightly across multiple residential properties and surrounding streets. This population appears to be sustained by ongoing artificial feeding occurring in nearby areas.

During the current breeding season, the noise has become severe and persistent, particularly overnight and in the early morning hours. The volume and frequency of the calls are significant enough to be heard throughout entire homes, even with windows closed and sound mitigation efforts in place.

For many residents, this is no longer a minor inconvenience. It is substantially affecting sleep, work performance, and daily functioning, and in some cases, children's ability to rest adequately before school. The impact is ongoing and has reached a level that interferes with normal residential use and quiet enjoyment of property.

I have attempted to seek guidance through both the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) and the Brevard County Sheriff's Office/Animal Control, however I was advised that this issue does not fall under their jurisdiction and no assistance was provided. As a result, I am reaching out at the County level for direction.

Because the birds are distributed across multiple parcels and nearby streets — including areas outside of HOA jurisdiction — this is not an issue that can be reasonably addressed by individual homeowners. Private trapping efforts are impractical without

coordinated access and would place an unfair financial burden on a single resident for what is clearly a community-wide condition.

Given these circumstances, I respectfully request:

- Evaluation of whether artificial feeding practices are contributing to an unsustainable concentration of animals
- Determination of whether this situation meets criteria for a public nuisance under county ordinances
- Guidance on enforcement options, if applicable
- Consideration of coordinated, humane population management strategies

Multiple residents are experiencing similar impacts and are beginning to reach out as well. We are seeking guidance and support from the County on how this situation can be addressed at an appropriate level.

I would appreciate any direction your office can provide regarding next steps or appropriate channels for resolution.

Commissioner Goodson,

Thank you for your previous response and for providing the relevant Brevard County ordinance.

After reviewing Sec. 14-57 – Creation of Nuisance, I would like to respectfully clarify that the current situation appears to meet multiple criteria outlined within the ordinance.

Specifically:

- Section (b) states that it is unlawful for an animal to make sounds persistently or continuously for a period of 15 minutes or longer when not properly contained. The peafowl in our area vocalize repeatedly throughout the night during breeding season, often waking residents multiple times and clearly exceeding this threshold.
- Section (f) states that feeding animals in a manner that creates a nuisance is prohibited. The continued artificial feeding occurring in nearby areas appears to be directly contributing to the sustained and increasing concentration of approximately 40–50 peafowl, which is the root cause of the ongoing disturbance.
- The issue spans multiple properties and is not confined to a single parcel, making it impractical for any individual homeowner to resolve independently.

Additionally, Section (g) indicates that nuisance complaints may be substantiated through affidavits from multiple residents. I am currently coordinating with other affected neighbors who are experiencing similar nighttime disturbance.

Given that this situation appears to meet the County's own nuisance criteria, I respectfully request:

- Confirmation that this issue qualifies for investigation under Sec. 14-57
- Guidance on submitting the required affidavits or formal documentation
- Direction on how Animal Services intends to investigate and enforce this ordinance in a multi-property scenario
- Clarification on whether enforcement actions can be taken regarding feeding practices contributing to the nuisance

This is an ongoing, nightly disturbance that is significantly affecting residents' ability to sleep and function normally, and we are seeking a clear path forward under the County's existing ordinance.

Commissioner Goodson,

I am following up regarding the ongoing peafowl nuisance issue in Merritt Island (32952), as well as the guidance I have received from both Brevard County Animal Services and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC).

At this point, I am seeking clarification and assistance at the County level due to conflicting direction between agencies.

- Brevard County Animal Services has advised that this is a wildlife issue and directed us to FWC
- FWC has previously advised that this is not within their scope and referred us back to local Animal Control

As a result, residents are being directed back and forth without a clear path to resolution, despite the issue continuing to significantly impact multiple households.

As previously outlined, there are approximately 40–50 peafowl roosting across multiple residential properties and nearby streets. During breeding season, the noise is persistent overnight and has become severe enough to disrupt sleep on a nightly basis, affecting work, daily functioning, and children's rest before school.

We have also attempted to follow the recommended mitigation strategies provided, including discouraging the birds from entering individual properties. However, this approach has not been effective, as the peafowl are roosting across multiple surrounding properties and public areas. There are several people feeding the peafowl so they do not leave. This is no longer a situation that can be managed at the individual property level.

Additionally, the Brevard County ordinance (Sec. 14-57) appears to apply in this situation, specifically regarding:

- Persistent noise disturbance
- Animal concentration across multiple properties
- Feeding practices contributing to a nuisance condition

Because this is a multi-property issue involving numerous parcels, it is not feasible or reasonable for a single homeowner to coordinate or fund private trapping efforts across multiple properties.

Given these circumstances, I respectfully request:

- Clarification on which agency has jurisdiction to investigate and enforce this nuisance condition
- Direction on how residents can formally proceed when agencies are unable to assume responsibility
- Consideration of a coordinated County-level response, given the scope and multi-resident impact

At least 10 other residents have now reported similar concerns, and we are seeking a clear and actionable path forward. Several residents are prepared to submit formal nuisance affidavits if required under Sec. 14-57(g).

Thank you for your time and assistance in helping resolve this ongoing issue.
