Subject:

Temporary Use Acknowledgement (TUA) for Brevard County Dewatering Activities for the Sykes Creek Muck Removal Project

Fiscal Impact:

Approximately \$500 for the cost of the public notification to neighbors within 1000 feet of the proposed site.

Dept/Office:

Natural Resources Management

Requested Action:

It is requested that the Board of County Commissioners authorize the Chair to (a) execute the attached Temporary Use Acknowledgement (TUA) to allow the Save Our Indian River Lagoon Program to use 7.43 acres of the 13.53-acre vacant parcel, currently considered for acquisition, for dewatering activities for the Sykes Creek Muck Removal Project; and (b) authorize the TUA to begin with the issuance of the Notice to Proceed to the contractor awarded Phase 2 of the Sykes Creek Muck Removal construction services contract and extending for 4 years. The site is located in Single-family Residential (RU111) and Medium-density Multiple-family Residential (RU215) zoning classifications.

Summary Explanation and Background:

As a background, five muck dredging project locations were selected as part of the Brevard County managed restoration initiative funded by the State Legislature with 20142016 appropriations. These projects include: Turkey Creek, Cocoa Beach Canals, Mims Boat Ramp, Grand Canal and Sykes Creek. The Sykes Creek Muck Removal Project is fully permitted and funded through FDEP Grant No. NS005 (\$8,180,000) and Save Our Indian River Lagoon Trust Fund (\$15,954,132), as approved by the Board on December 6, 2016 and April 9, 2019, respectively.

The Sykes Creek Muck Removal Project (Ph1 & Ph2) will remove a total of 642,000 cubic yards of muck from the southern portion of Sykes Creek system. Phase 1 will use Kiwanis Island for dewatering, treatment and storage. For Phase 2, staff proposes that muck will be dredged and transported via a pipeline to a proposed 7.43-acre dewatering facility, within the 13.53-acre vacant parcel currently considered for acquisition. Construction of this Phase 2 project is anticipated to commence in 2021 and is estimated to last 34 years.

The availability of upland processing areas for the treatment of dredge spoils is a limiting factor in Brevard County. As the distance between dredging and spoil processing and handling sites increases, booster pumps must be added. Booster pumps are required as project pump distances approach one-mile and are required at one-mile intervals thereafter. Booster pumps can complicate project operations and increase cost, particularly if multiple booster pumps are needed. Based on consultations with contracted engineering team:492

and dredging contractors, staff estimates that each booster pump adds \$1 per cubic yard (CY) of material dredged. The pump distance to the nearest Florida Inland Navigation District site (BV11) for the Sykes Creek Muck Dredging Project is approximately 8 miles. The Sykes Creek Phase 2 project is expected to be greater than 500,000 CY, so moving 500,000 CY through 8 booster pumps would add approximately \$4M to the project cost.

Acquisition and development costs for the proposed site are expected to be less than \$2M, with an estimated acquisition cost of approximately \$1M and the project site engineering, design and construction costs of approximately \$750,000. The total estimated cost savings for use of the site, as an alternative to pumping the FIND site, is over \$2M.

Temporary use of this parcel as a dredge material dewatering site for Phase 2 of the Sykes Creek Muck Removal Project has been thoroughly evaluated and selected as the most cost effective, nonintrusive site for dredge material management in this highly developed Merritt Island area.

During the design and permitting process, significant effort will be made to avoid impacts to wetlands and minimize disturbance of neighbors and area residents. The site design will incorporate safety precautions along the N. Banana River Drive access location, including signage and flagmen during active trucking operations. The site design will maintain a natural buffer of existing vegetation between Sykes Creek and the work area. A vegetated berm and buffer will be installed along the perimeter of the temporary dredge material management work area. In addition, water separated from the muck will be actively treated to minimize nitrogen and phosphorus returned to Sykes Creek.

After dewatering and treatment on site, dredged materials will be relocated to a permanent beneficial use or disposal location and the temporarily used dewatering site will be redesigned as a stormwater or surface water treatment area. The Merritt Island Redevelopment Agency (MIRA) supports the final use of this site as a stormwater treatment area, which is consistent with the comprehensive plan and their goals (MIRA support letter attached). Final site design is anticipated to consist primarily of a large open area with a 15-foot buffer of plants maintained around the perimeter.

TEMPORARY USE ACKNOWLEDGMENT
BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BREVARD COUNTY

THIS ACKNOWLEDGEMENT, Made this 17 day of, September 2019 by the **BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BREVARD COUNTY ("BCC")**, **FLORIDA**, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, as follows:

1. TEMPORARY DREDGED MATERIAL DEWATERING ACTIVITIES

a) In connection with the Sykes Creek Muck Removal Project, the County shall utilize a portion of the County's property located in the Single-family Residential (RU-1-11) and Medium-density Multiple-family Residential (RU-2-15) zoning classifications to temporarily allow the construction and operation of a temporary dredged material dewatering facility in conjunction with temporary parking and storage of construction equipment and materials, if necessary.

b) The purpose is to fulfill the County's obligation to conduct muck dredging along the southern segment of the Sykes Creek as part of the County's effort to conduct environmental restoration dredging to improve water quality within the Indian River Lagoon. The project is a direct public benefit by removing nutrient-laden muck material that smothers the natural bottom, clouds the water, prevents the growth of seagrass, and contributes to harmful algal blooms.

c) The temporary dredged material management activities will include (a) clearing of vegetation, (b) site excavation and grading to create staging areas for equipment and materials, drying areas, stormwater swales, an access road, and a containment area for dredged materials, (c) ingress/egress of highway haul trucks, and (d) loading dredged material onto highway haul trucks. Equipment on-site may include, but is not limited to, front-end loader(s), trackhoe, skid steer, backhoe, and highway haul trucks. Contractor's activities on-site will typically be between the hours of 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM.

d) Upon completion of the dredge activities and the associated dewatering of dredged material the County will require the removal of all equipment and materials from the site. Thereafter site restoration will occur. Site Restoration will include (a) removal of temporary construction access road, (b) restoration of site grades to pre-construction conditions, and (c) conversion of the site to a stormwater treatment facility. Established vegetative buffers and berms between the site and the adjacent residential properties will remain in place.

e) The temporary uses described in paragraph (a) above are to be located on the property described by the Brevard County Property Identification Number as 24-37-31-00-4. The legal description is attached hereto and made part hereof as Exhibit "A".

f) This location is directly adjacent to property lines under different ownership, and no less than 15 feet from the nearest dwelling unit. The temporary dredged material management area will be buffered from residential property by a 15-foot vegetative buffer and berm. The temporary use will be subject to the noise limitations prescribed in Chapter 46, Article IV, Sections 46-126 through 46-131 Code of Ordinances of Brevard County, Florida.

g) This temporary use by the County is for a period of four (4) years effective upon execution by Brevard County and the issuance of the Notice to Proceed to the Contractor awarded the construction services contract for the Sykes Creek Phase II Muck Removal Project.



Dear Property Owner:

The Brevard County Planning and Development Department advises you as a property owner within 1,000', that Brevard County is seeking approval of a temporary use for a portion of a 13+ acre parcel considered for acquisition by Brevard County. The property is located west of N. Banana River Drive, just south of Phyllis Drive, and approximately 1/3 Mile north of State Road 520.

Specifically: Brevard County has requested a Temporary Use Agreement to utilize approximately 7.43 acres of the 13.53 acre site for temporary dewatering activities as part of the Sykes Creek Muck Removal Project. These activities include the development of the site for dewatering of the dredged material, use of heavy equipment to process dredged material and load haul trucks, and the ingress/egress of haul trucks to remove the dredged material from the site. It is anticipated that the project duration will require two to four years to complete. If approved, the site will be used for four years. All temporary equipment, supplies, etc. shall be removed from the property prior to the expiration of the temporary use agreement. The restored site will serve as a stormwater treatment area. The 4-year TUA will commence on the same date that the Notice to Proceed is issued to the construction contractor who is awarded the contract for use of this site.

The public hearing will be held at the Brevard County Government Center Commission Chambers, 2725 - Judge Fran Jamieson Way, Bldg. "C", Viera, Florida by the Board of County Commissioners on **September 17, 2019** beginning at **9:00AM**.

You are invited to attend the public hearing to voice any comments you may have. You may also write to the address shown at the top of this notice. Please direct telephone inquiries to Matt Culver in Brevard County's Natural Resources Management Department at **(321) 372-5196**.



Having not received the Notice regarding this subject, my input is based on reading a neighbors Notice.

1. It appears the dredge work will include canals from SR520 to SR 528. Muck will be pumped from North to South and eventually trucked from South to North for final disposition.
2. The dredged muck will be pumped into the lagoon area (open water) between Phyllis Dr. and SR 520 where it will be “dewatered.” Has someone discovered a way to defy the laws of physics? Dewater by dumping wet muck into open water! Note; The spoil island North of Kiwanis Island was the Dewatering Area years ago when these canals were last cleaned.
3. The dewatered material will be transferred (?) to land between the backyards of Phyllis Drive residents and the logistics operations area behind Walmart.
4. Heavy haul trucks will access Banana River Dr. by waiting for a break in Port Canaveral Guest and Worker traffic on the blind curve at Phyllis Dr. and then, several blocks North, break into more of this traffic at the notorious Triangle, (Minabos Nightmare.) then continue North past Audubon School to SR 528. (Please see the “Pump it South to Haul it North” of 1. Above.)
5. Is money included in the plan to rebuild these residential streets after this four-year project? Heavy vehicles are already prohibited from these streets for good reason.

Related considerations:

In the 1960’s East Merritt Island was accessible from the South (SR 520,) from the North (a two-lane SR 528) and the single lane Hump Back Bridge. With the new Hurdle Bridge CCAFS and NASA employees soon used this attractive shortcut. It wasn’t long before Passengers and crew members from the Cruise Ships soon added to this traffic flow making it near impossible for residents to access our residential streets.

This subject was presented to both the Brevard County and Port Commissioners as a growing problem. As newer Ships are brought into service, thousands of additional Guest and Crew will only aggravate this traffic problem.
