Ten Appointments to the Save Our Indian River Lagoon Citizen Oversight Committee

Fiscal Impact:

Requested Action:

It is requested that the Board of County Commissioners: 1) consider confirming the appointment of the applicants selected by the League of Cities for the vacant Economics/Finance Voting Member, Lagoon Commerce Voting Member, Lagoon Education/Outreach/Advocacy Voting Member, and Science Alternate seats; and 2) review applications, resumes and reference letters and rank candidates to fill the County Commission's vacant Science Voting Member, Technology Voting Member, Tourism Voting Member, Economics/Finance Alternate, Lagoon Commerce Alternate, and Lagoon Education/Outreach/Advocacy Alternate and 3) Consider appointment of the top ranked candidates.

Summary Explanation and Background:

On August 23, 2016, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance No. 1615 for the Save Our Indian River Lagoon Project Plan and Trust Fund. The Ordinance called for establishment of a Citizen Oversight Committee (Committee) to make recommendations to the County Commission regarding annual updates to the Save Our Indian River Lagoon Project Plan that is funded by the half cent Save Our Indian River Lagoon sales tax.

The Citizen Oversight Committee is comprised of 7 voting members, 7 alternates and 2 non-voting, emeritus seats. Originally, the 7 fields of expertise were: Science, Technology, Economics/Finance, Real Estate, Education/Outreach, Tourism, and Lagoon Advocacy. On October 22, 2024, the Board of County Commissioners combined Lagoon Advocacy with Education and Outreach to dedicate a field of expertise to Lagoon Commerce, aimed at engaging citizens who work on the lagoon and experience changing conditions in real-time. The Board also added 2 non-voting, emeritus positions to provide historical knowledge.

Half of the Committee is nominated by the Space Coast League of Cities and half of the Committee is selected by the County Commission, with all seats appointed by the County Commission. Terms are for 2 years, after which members and alternates can be reappointed or replaced. When replacement voting members or alternates are needed, the entity who selected that seat can:

- 1) upgrade the alternate to the member seat,
- 2) choose a replacement from the existing pool of applicants, or

3) request a new call for qualified citizen volunteers.

On October 22, 2024, the Board of County Commissioners re-appointed 6 current members (including 3 of 7 Board seats and 3 of 7 re-appointment requests from the League of Cities). The Board also appointed 2 emeritus positions (1 Board selection and confirmation of 1 selection by the League of Cities) and directed staff to advertise the remaining 8 seats (4 Board seats and 4 League of Cities seats). Advertisements for the remaining vacancies were posted for a month and closed on December 20, 2024.

Action 1:

Consider appointment of the following applicants selected by the League of Cities:

- Curt Smith (current Alternate) for the vacant Economics/Finance Voting Member,
- Richard Bankhead for the vacant Lagoon Commerce Voting Member,
- Kimberly Newton (current Alternate) for the vacant Lagoon Education/Outreach/Advocacy Voting Member, and
- Nicholas Sanzone for the Science Alternate seat.

Their applications are attached.

Action 2:

Review applications, resumes and reference letters and rank candidates to fill the County Commission's Science Voting Member, Technology Voting Member, Tourism Voting Member, Lagoon Commerce Alternate, Economics/Finance Alternate (if Curt Smith is promoted to the League's voting member seat), and Lagoon Education/Outreach/Advocacy Alternate (if Kimberly Newton is promoted to the League's voting member seat).

For the Board's voting member seat to represent Science, there are eight application packets, including the current Technology Alternate, who is seeking promotion to a voting member seat, and 2 applicants who have been selected by the League of Cities for other seats. If the Board selects the current Technology Alternate to fill this voting member seat, the League of Cities requests that the Board confirm Bruce Larson to backfill their vacant alternate seat.

For the Board's voting member seat to represent Technology, there are nine application packets, including the current Technology Alternate seeking promotion to the voting member seat, and 1 applicant who has been selected by the League of Cities for another seat.

For the Board's voting member seat to represent Tourism, there are three application packets, including the current Tourism Alternate seeking promotion to the voting member seat, and 2 applicants who have been selected by the League of Cities for other seats.

For the Board's alternate to represent Lagoon Commerce, there are four application packets, including 2 applicants who have been selected by the League of Cities for other seats.

For the Board's alternate to represent Economics/Finance Alternate (if Curt Smith is promoted to the League's voting member seat), there are five application packets, including 1 applicant who has been selected by the League of Cities for another seat.

For the Board's alternate to represent Lagoon Education/Outreach/Advocacy Alternate (if Kimberly Newton is promoted to the League's voting member seat), there are eight application packets, including 2 applicants who have been selected by the League of Cities for other seats.

After public comment on this item, a form is attached to use for ranking the applicants for each seat. Assign number 1 to your top ranked candidate, 2 to the second ranked candidate, and 3 to the third ranked candidate. A rank of 4 will be assigned to all remaining candidates. Staff will tabulate the ranking scores during the Board meeting and report the results to the Commission for the Board's consideration in making appointments.

Action 3:

Appoint the applicants as directed by Board action and confirm the League of Cities' selection of a backfill candidate for Technology Alternate, if applicable.

I dedicated myself to understanding our lagoon ecosystem and went to the University of Florida where I received my Bachelors of Science with a degree in Soil and Water Science. After working for the National Parks in Florida for 2 years I went to work for the Marine Resources Council where I helped rally the community to vote for the 1/2 cent sales tax that funds the Save Our Indian River Lagoon program. I graduated in 2010 with a Bachelor of Science with a degree in Soil and Water Science, I my more than a decade of professional experience I have planted native species of upland and benthic plants, from mangroves to seagrasses and more. My work with oysters and clams is extensive, including working with some of the best environmental scientists working on the lagoon. I worked for local eco tour companies as a Environmental Narrator. I have worked for many years on projects within the Indian River Lagoon (IRL) system. I originally worked on the Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs) back in the 1990s and on the Basin Management Action Plans (BMAPs). Those are the reason for the development of the original Save Our Indian River Lagoon plan, i.e. to fund the projects on the plans. In that time, I studied the seagrasses and water quality within the system through the die-off. As I retired from my profession as an estuarine/marine ecologist, I looked for opportunities to stay involved in the IRL restoration. I have served for two years on the Citizens Oversight Committee in an alternate position and would like to move into a voting position. I am in a unique position of having been involved in the COC and am ready to take on a more involved role. This has made me very aware of eutrophication in lagoonal systems within Florida. I want to bring my experience and love of marine biology to assist in restoring the Indian River Lagoon. It all began in the 4th grade I read a book on whales and another on sharks. At that point, I knew I wanted to be a Marine Biologist. My quest continued through college where I received a degree in Zoology with a focus on Marine Biology. Unfortunately, at that time there were limited job opportunities in shark research, so I went into healthcare management. But my love for the waterways and oceans continued. In 1995 I began driving down from Jacksonville and fishing the Mosquito Lagoon and the north end of the Indian River. I recall the incredibly clear water, seagrass, and amazing fishing. When the Seagrass die-offs occurred, the devastation was clear. Over 15 years ago, Laura, my wife, and I, while living in Jacksonville, Florida decided if we could live anywhere, we would move down here to the Indian River Lagoon. We had been coming down together and with our children, kayaking, boating, fishing, and going to the Merritt Island Wildlife Refuge and the Kennedy Space Center. In 2021 we were able to move here and now live in Merritt Island, on Sykes Creek. As with all of us in Brevard County, the Lagoon is in essence our backyard. Once here, I decided to volunteer to help in the restoration of this paradise and began doing some volunteer work with MRC, and others and founded Xplore the IRL, a YouTube and Facebook channel to discuss the efforts of groups and individuals in the community working to restore the Indian River Lagoon. The channel also highlights activities and places to visit. It brings me back to what I wanted to do in the 4th grade. Helping restore the Lagoon is one of the volunteer areas I now focus on as my working career winds down and my volunteer career winds up.

Please provide a brief overview of your background and experience (education, professional experience, and community volunteer experience) as it relates to your understanding of the Save our Indian River Lagoon Project Plan (SOIRLPP) and the restoration needs of the Indian River Lagoon.

My educational background includes a BA in Zoology from the University of California at Berkeley. During that time, I worked in a lab with one of the leading experts on Cichlids, as well as spent a summer as an unpaid Intern at the Mote Marine Laboratory where I worked on a sediment analysis of Tampa Bay, studies of animal populations using seine nets along the beaches and collected sharks offshore. I also grew up working summers in my father's lab, he was a professor of Medicine at UC Davis and at that time his research focus was on air pollution. In Healthcare I have been a hospital CEO, Vice President/General Manager of an HMO, and founded a chronic care/disease management company. In these positions, I oversaw the operations and finance of multimillion-dollar organizations. Understanding and evaluating their finances, services, and operations. For the past 12 years, I have been a consultant working internationally in Population Health through my company Accountable Health, LLC. Additionally, I teach in the Executive Master's Program at the John D. Bower School of Population Health at the University of Mississippi Medical Center and have been a member of the editorial board of the journal Population Health Management since 2012. This background has provided me with experience in program development and evaluation, finance, information technology, digital health (using wearable and other devices to monitor and provide data on individuals), operations, marketing, and working within an organization as well as as an external consultant. Two very different roles. As the Cofounder and lead host of a radio show, PopHealth Week now in its 9th year, and the AMCP Podcast Series - Listen Up, I understand communications and have brought that experience to Xplore the IRL, my social media channel about the Indian River Lagoon. Like others on the committee, I bring a unique background and diverse lenses with which to look at the issues, proposals, interventions, and results of our efforts to restore the lagoon. My volunteer work locally includes working with MRC, the Brevard Indian River Lagoon Coalition, Waterway Warriors, Xplore the IRL (my own YouTube/Facebook Channel), attending COC meetings either in person or via the internet, and many lagoon-related events. I also spend considerable time on the lagoon observing the health of the lagoon from Mosquito Lagoon in the north down to Sebastian Inlet, fishing, boating, paddleboarding, looking at wildlife, pulling tires and trash from the lagoon, as well as growing mangroves and oysters at our house. Other volunteer activities include participating in the Michael J Fox Parkinson's Progression Marker Initiative as a clinical study volunteer for over 8 years (my father lived with Lewy Body Disease). Three years ago, I was asked to be a volunteer member of their participant committee, which requires attending quarterly calls and their annual research conference as well as reviewing and testing their website, new initiatives, and health apps. In the past, I volunteered as the outdoor activity coordinator for Boy Scout Troop 14 in Jacksonville, FL, and worked with Jim Kern, the founder of the Florida Trail on his non-profit Friends of the Florida Trail. I understand from a scientific perspective the issues the Lagoon is facing, including the major sources of pollution, the various projects being implemented to mitigate these issues, and the ways to measure progress. A clear point for the community to understand is what we in population health call "leading and lagging indicators". Some of the things we are doing are leading indicators such as the number of septic to sewer conversions or the amount of muck removal, others are lagging indicators such as water quality, seagrass growth, and the improvement in the health of the populations of animals and plants. These lagging indicators take time to show changes.

Please describe what character, judgement, analytical, communication, and group consensus building strengths you would contribute to the purposes and duties of the Save Our Indian River Lagoon Citizen Oversight Committee.

My goals in healthcare are to make things better with a focus on disadvantaged populations and individuals. Since 1994 much of my work has been with Medicaid beneficiaries. I ran a Medicaid health plan and later founded a company that developed programs for beneficiaries living with 10 chronic diseases or conditions, including the first disease management program in Medicaid for people living with HIV/AIDS and the first for people living with Schizophrenia. This can be directly translated to the work of the COC as the approach used to improve the health of populations is similar to the approach used to restore the lagoon, with just a few key differences being the measurements, interventions, and results. It is also clear that the health of the lagoon impacts the health of those living near it and recreating on it. As a committee member, understanding how the government works, the various bid processes, contracting, etc. is another key area. My experience includes advocating for legislation, contracting directly with states, a city, and a county library, getting the Annual Medicare Wellness Visit into the Affordable Care Act, and testifying before four State Legislatures. Like other committee members, I am comfortable serving as a voice for the Committee and Lagoon as well as the ears to the community's thoughts, effectively representing those we serve. I have learned these skills through my work in healthcare as well as through my Radio Show/Podcast work and more recently with my social media channel Xplore the IRL. Reviewing and understanding data is an important part of the Committee's work. While not a statistician, I am a member of the editorial board of the journal Population Health Management and have reviewed countless studies submitted to the journal for publication during my 12-plus year tenure. My current class at the University and many of my speaking engagements are on "Value-Based Care", determining the value of specific health interventions and technologies, which again is similar to the value determinations of the various projects proposed for the Lagoon. I have also done significant analytic work throughout my career including a project where I developed an Access Database to analyze two years of Medicaid medical claims data for one State representing over 600,000 Medicaid lives including importing and analyzing all inpatient, outpatient, and pharmacy claims (15 million pharmacy claims alone) to identify individuals with one of four chronic diseases, their costs and utilization of services, as well as gaps in care and other metrics. The report I generated was used by the State to determine the potential impact of various interventions and later to develop an RFP for services. Again, similar to the work the committee does to determine the potential benefits of the various interventions. My work as a consultant requires me to generate consensus to help my clients make changes and move organizations forward. I have also served as the Chair of the Board and Interim CEO for the Population Health Alliance, an international non-profit trade association. This position required the ability to work with many different people and companies from around the US and the world to build consensus on the organization's work, topics, and reports.

Please describe the importance of committee members putting public interests first and avoiding real or perceived conflicts of interest in making recommendations for expenditure of the Save Our Indian River Lagoon Trust Funds.

The work of committee members must be of the highest ethical level. There are hundreds of millions of dollars being expended on behalf of the community. As mentioned in the question, even "perceived conflicts" can lead to mistrust and potential failure of the efforts to restore the lagoon. My reputation is everything to me and has been developed in over 40 years in healthcare. I have written about the need for greater ethics in healthcare. This same approach will be brought to this position. In my consulting work, I have always sought to ensure that my activities are not in conflict or perceived to represent a conflict of interest between my various clients. I ensure appropriate confidentiality and recognize when potential conflicts, of interest may arise. My work with the University of Mississippi Medical Center includes a clear conflict of interest statement regarding my company and its work, my relationship with the University, and how I cannot use my university relationship to enhance my consulting business. I have had conversations with the Dean of the program discussing specific instances to ensure I stay compliant.

	I have enjoyed being on the IRL for my entire life. My earliest memories of playing outside were along the shores of the IRL. My grandfather operated a recreational fishing pier and my dad ran a nearby boat dealership. My family lived in an apartmen above the boat dealership. Our entire world revolved around the lagoon. My earliest work experiences involved fishing on the lagoon. The restaurant that I co-own and operate today is totally dependent on healthy sea grass beds in the IRL because our reputation was built on serving local wild caught shrimp. The white shrimp, brown shrimp, and hoppers that our shrimp boats catch out in the ocean grow up in the sea grass beds of the IRL.
	When I was a youngster in the 1950s-1960s, the lagoon was clear and the fishing was incredible. Fish kills were rare and mostly related to cold weather incidents. Hundreds of families made a living from its bountiful waters. For the past forty years I have personally witnessed the sad decline of the IRL to where only a handful of people even try to make a living fishing its waters today. Commercial fishing is almost a thing of the past and many of our recreational fishing guides are now working out of state. The demise of the IRL is a threat to our multi-billion-dollar tourism and real estate industries. Its condition could be a detriment to our ability to attract new employees to our County's growing technology sector, not to mention to the quality of life of our Brevard County residents.
	Brevard County is leading the way in estuary restoration and can be a model for how to address the state-wide threat of declining water quality. For twenty years I have done everything I can do to educate people about the need to fix the problems affecting the IRL. The Save Our Indian River Lagoon Program Plan is the first time that a concentrated county-wide effort is being made to correct the issues that are plaguing the IRL. I want to be a part of that solution.
	5. Please provide a brief overview of your background and experience (education, professional experience, and community volunteer experience) as it relates to your understanding of the SOIRLPP and the restoration needs of the Indian River Lagoon.
	I commercially fished the IRL from the mid-1960s to the mid-1970s. I went to college for three years at Florida Institute of Technology's School of Marine and Environmental Technology, earning an AA in Oceanographic Technology. Following college, I ran a commercial longline fishing boat in the Gulf of Mexico and South Atlantic. I left the sea in 1987 and have worked at my family's seafood restaurant in Titusville since then.
1	I started the first guided kayak eco-tourism business in Brevard County in 1997, Osprey Outfitters. That same year, I started the Space Coast Birding and Wildlife Festival. Envisioned to be a local project mainly to educate the business community about the economic benefit of conservation lands in Brevard County, it is now one of the top events of its type in the country, attracting of the document of the strength of the stren

I have served on the Brevard County Tourist Development Council for nineteen years. I was appointed to be a voice for ecotourism on the board, a role in which I continue to participate. I am Chair of the TDC's Beach Improvement Committee, which recently approved eight IRL restoration grants. I am on the Board of Directors for the Florida Restaurant and Lodging Association and its Space Coast Chapter. I did a presentation on Florida's Harmful Algal Blooms to the FRLA Board last June and have been encouraging the Florida tourism industry to take a leadership role in addressing Florida's declining water quality issues. I am a participating member of the IRL Council's Management Board, the Deepwater Shrimp Advisory Panel for the South Atlantic Fisheries Management Council, the Southeastern Fisheries Association, the Board of Directors for the Merritt Island Wildlife Association, the IRL Spoil Island Working Group, and the Brevard Indian River Coalition. I am a Trustee for Hubbs Sea World Research Institute. I served for six years on the Brevard County Planning and Zoning Board and participated in the following land use planning initiatives: Brevard Tomorrow, Titusville 2020, Titusville Tomorrow and myregion.org. I am a former board member for Space Coast Audubon and was on the Sea Grant Marine Advisory Committee.

Alliance was created in 1999 to be a non-profit umbrella for the birding festival. As a founding member of the BNA, I have soundly supported its mission to build public awareness and appreciation of the value of Brevard County's natural resources.

6. Please describe what character, judgement, analytical, communication, and group consensus building strengths you would contribute to the purposes and duties of the Save Our Indian River Lagoon Citizen Oversight Committee.

I am a passionate, honest, hard-working, dedicated person that gives 100% when tasked with projects. Over the years I have participated in numerous consensus-building exercises in tourism, land use planning and the environment. I personally conducted public meetings throughout the county to solicit input for Brevard County's Hidden Gems tourism marketing campaign. The sites selected were the personal favorites of Brevard County residents. I oversee the program development and operation of the Space Coast Birding and Wildlife Festival each year with forty local volunteers and more than one hundred speaker and field trip leader volunteers from all over the world. In 2012, I helped to organize and sponsor a forum with The Conservation Fund that was attended by 200 community leaders. It was called "Awakening the Possibilities: Balancing Nature and Commerce on Florida's Space Coast." The result of that forum was an increase in eco-tourism marketing by the county's office of tourism. I am the Chair of the Tourist Development Council's Beach Improvement Committee from where I encouraged the TDC to use some of the Beach Improvement Funds for IRL restoration projects.

For more than fifteen years I have been doing presentations on what the IRL was like when I was growing up in the 1950s, 60s, and 70s. I now have images to go with the talk and am willing to go anywhere to talk to anyone about the IRL's past and why we need to fix the lagoon. I have a newly added presentation with images about a sea grass project, of which I was the major financier and driving force behind. I also have a presentation on harmful algal blooms that was directed at Florida's tourism leadership that I can do. I went to Washington DC to address Congressional staff members of the bi-partisan House Estuary Caucus on Florida's harmful algal blooms. I have hosted numerous meetings with many different agencies concerning the IRL at my restaurant. I am one of North Brevard County's largest employers, with approximately 140 workers at my restaurant where we proudly support the Brevard Zoo's "Shuck and Share" oyster restoration project. I believe that education is critically important for we cannot reasonably expect our citizens to support something of which they know little about.

Living and working on and near the sea instilled a lifelong passion for the preservation of these natural areas and the diverse species that are dependent upon their perpetuity.

After leaving the ocean in 1987, first-hand experience in stressed Gulf of Mexico fisheries led Laurilee to take part in preservation efforts closer to home. When overfishing threatened the habitat and future supply of rock shrimp, she encouraged her entire family to step in and lead the efforts to end trawling in the fragile Oculina Reef and put a management plan in place for the rock shrimp fishery. The result was a first for the South Atlantic Fisheries Management Council when they approved a fisheries management plan for the shrimping industry that was based upon input from the industry itself. Laurilee continues to make yearly trips to Washington DC to educate members of Congress about the U.S. commercial fishing industry.

While transitioning from a seafaring lifestyle, Laurilee developed an intense desire to connect people with nature. This led to a seat on the Brevard County Tourist Development Council and many eco-tourism endeavors. The most notable is the **Space Coast Birding and Wildlife Festival**, which Laurilee founded in 1997.

This annual event, Florida's first major birding festival and now one of the top birding festivals in the nation, is heralded as a model for festivals nationwide due to the exceptional lineup of seminar presenters and high-quality field trips. Birders of all levels, wildlife enthusiasts, biologists, ornithologists and international birding and adventure tour operators travel from all over the world to support this benchmark tradition. Laurilee has attended a

wide variety of forums and addressed many organizations to raise awareness of the benefits that nature-based and heritage tourism can bring to a community.

1997 was also the year that Laurilee started the first guided kayak eco-tour operation in Brevard County, Osprey Outfitters. It has since been through three owners and a name change. A Day Away Kayak Outfitters is now one of the most successful guided kayak tour businesses in the state, introducing thousands of people each year to the wonders of the Indian River Lagoon.

During early development of the Great Florida Birding Trail, Laurilee was instrumental in securing for Brevard County 21% of the site nominations out of the 18-county East Florida Section by personally filling out 45 lengthy nomination forms and escorting Julie Wraithmell, Birding Trail Coordinator, for site inspections. This resulted in the placement of 32 Brevard County sites on the Great Florida Birding Trail Map. Five additional Brevard County sites were added when the East Section of the Great Florida Birding Trail was updated in 2008. Brevard County has more Great Florida Birding Trail sites than any other county in Florida.

Laurilee has been an outspoken advocate for the establishment of a network of multi-use bike trails in Florida. The business core of downtown Titusville is experiencing revitalization due to the presence of three major multi-use trails that will soon pass through the city. Laurilee was recognized as a "Trail Champion" at the 2016 annual meeting of the Florida Trails Foundation.

Lately her emphasis during public speaking has shifted from talks about the benefits of nature-based and heritage tourism to talks about what it was like growing up on the Indian River Lagoon and the critical importance of bringing it back to its former beauty and productivity. A rabid proponent for restoration of her beloved Indian River Lagoon, Laurilee gives talks to anyone that will listen.

Because of the vital importance of sea grasses to Indian River Lagoon restoration, Laurilee was the major funder and driving force behind a successful pilot project to introduce nursery-grown sea grass into the Banana River Lagoon near the Merritt Island Airport. It is her hope that this technology will be used to hasten sea grass coverage when water quality improves sufficiently for sea grasses to survive in the Lagoon. She has developed a presentation about the sea grass project too.

Through her business, as well as her personal life, Laurilee is an important advocate for the promotion, protection, and use of our natural resources in a responsible manner. She says, "The Indian River is the heart and soul of our community. Our economy and our quality of life depend on her survival."



In a professional sense, I have transitioned from full-time employment to what some would call semi-retirement, while increasing my level of community involvement as a means of staying active and giving back. I have loved and enjoyed nature since I was a child, including outings on my uncle's boat around the spoil islands of the Indian River near Sebastian. When my husband and I moved from Orlando to Indian Harbour Beach in 2014, we chose to be near the waters we loved off Dragon Point where we kept our first sailboat years before, only to learn later that the pristine waters I knew as a child and the wildlife I valued were in peril. This has naturally motivated me to engage in protecting the lagoon as time has permitted, and the opportunity to serve on the Citizen Advisory Committee would allow me to increase that commitment and contribute to an endeavor that is both a passion and an obligation to future generations of Brevard County residents.
