Requested Action:

It is requested that the Board of County Commissioners declare the week of April 9, 2017 – April 15, 2017 National Public Safety Telecommunications Week.

Summary Explanation & Background:

Congress has designated the second week of April each year as National Public Safety Telecommunications Week to further public awareness and recognition of those individuals who are the public's first point of contact with emergency services.

The E-911 Administration Office, utilizing sophisticated equipment provided by the local exchange carrier and with the cooperation of the Brevard County Sheriff's Office, Brevard County Fire Rescue and nine (9) municipalities: Titusville Police Department, Cocoa Police Department, Rockledge Police Department, Melbourne Police Department, Cocoa Beach Police Department, Satellite Beach Police Department, Indian Harbour Beach Police Department, and Indialantic Police Department, provides quality access for citizens of Brevard County to the E-911 System.

Our Public Safety Telecommunicators are an integral part of the Brevard County E-911 System. They are the first of our "first responders" in a crisis situation. This Resolution recognizes all Public Safety Telecommunicators for their dedication to duty, professionalism and commitment to saving lives, property and the prevention of crime.


