

Subject:

Approval to Advertise Request for Proposals for Stormwater Outreach and Education, Stormwater (SW) Outreach and Engagement Campaign, and Save Our Indian River Lagoon (SOIRL) Outreach and Engagement Campaigns and select, award, and execute contracts with selected vendors.

Requested Action:

It is requested that the Board: 1) Authorize advertising of Request For Proposals (RFP) for: a) the Stormwater outreach and education program, b) the Stormwater Outreach and Engagement campaign, and c) the SOIRL Outreach and Engagement campaigns; 2) Authorize a selection committee with representatives from the County, two or three of the partnering municipalities, and the SOIRL Citizen Oversight Committee; 3) Authorize negotiation and award of Contracts; and 4) Authorize the execution of related Contracts, Modifications, Amendments, Task Orders, and Change Orders over \$200,000 by the County Manager, all others in accordance with signature authorities outlined in Administrative Order 29 and BCC Policy 25, after necessary reviews and approvals by the County Attorney, Purchasing, and Risk Management.

Summary Explanation and Background:

In 2011, Brevard County entered an interlocal partnership with eight municipalities to work collaboratively with an outreach service provider and a marketing firm to deliver a unified pollution prevention message county-wide. The General Stormwater Pollution Prevention Outreach Agreement and the Stormwater Outreach and Engagement Campaign Services Agreements are expiring at the end of January 2024. Brevard County and partnering municipalities are required under the Florida Department of Environmental Protection National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Stormwater Sewer System Generic Permit, to promote awareness and good stewardship to protect the Indian River Lagoon and other surface waters of Brevard County. The NPDES program was established by the Clean Water Act to control point source and stormwater discharges from point sources to surface waters. The County needs to select qualified providers to continue to meet the partnership obligations and fulfill the Basin Management Action Plan (BMAP) and NPDES permit requirements.

The SOIRL Project Plan, adopted by the County Commission in 2016, recognized potential benefits from

expanding fertilizer outreach and engagement beyond the existing pollution prevention programs funded by the stormwater utilities. The SOIRL Outreach and Engagement campaigns have additional focus on encouraging citizens to practice good septic system maintenance, manage grass clippings, lawn chemicals and irrigation, and implement other Stormwater Best Management Practices. These efforts contribute to fulfilling the County's BMAP and NPDES permit requirements.

THIRD AMENDMENT TO EXISTING INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR STORMWATER EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

THIS AMENDMENT is made and entered into on the date of the last signature below by and between the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA (hereinafter referred as "County"), the CITY OF CAPE CANAVERAL ("Cape Canaveral"), the CITY OF COCOA ("Cocoa"), the CITY OF COCOA BEACH ("Cocoa Beach"), the TOWN of GRANT-VALKARIA ("Grant-Valkaria"), the CITY OF INDIAN HARBOUR BEACH ("Indian Harbour Beach"), the TOWN OF MALABAR ("Malabar"), the CITY OF MELBOURNE ("Melbourne"), and the CITY OF WEST MELBOURNE ("West Melbourne") (Collectively the "Municipalities").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties hereto previously entered into an Interlocal Agreement on November 1st, 2011("Agreement") for stormwater education and public outreach and the Agreement was subsequently amended on December 11, 2012 and October 10, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to amend the terms of said Agreement as to Section 5. Allocation of Costs and Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and covenants herein contained, it is mutually agreed between the parties as follows:

1. Section 5. ALLOCATION OF COST. a. Program Costs is deleted and replaced with:

The cost for the Education Program will be paid by the County. The Municipalities agree to reimburse the County in accordance with the funding requirement set forth in the Education Program (the "Contribution") and subject to paragraph 7 below. See Amended Exhibit A. Section V. Funding. The annual Contribution for each Municipality is calculated using a minimum base fee of \$173.00 per Deliverable Point. The base fee will be reviewed in June every year and adjusted, if necessary, using the Consumer Price Index (CPI); however, the base fee shall not be less than \$173.00 per Deliverable Point. The net cost contributed by the County, after reimbursement by the

municipalities, is estimated to be \$50,170.00 per contract year. Failure of any Municipality to pay its respective Contribution shall not require the remaining Municipalities to be responsible for paying any portion of the payment that was due from the non-paying Municipality.

2. Section 6. TIMETABLE OF PAYMENTS. is deleted and replaced with:

Full payment will be made on an annual basis and due on September 30 of each year.

- 3. Exhibit A. Section V. Funding is deleted and replaced with Amended Exhibit A. Section V. Funding, which is attached and incorporated herein.
- 4. All terms and conditions of the previous Agreement and Amendments, which are incorporated herein by this reference, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Third Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.
