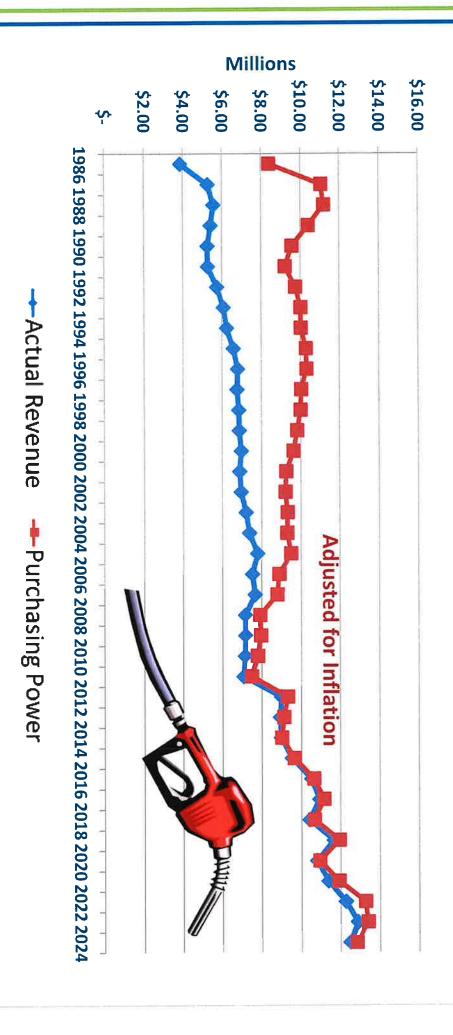
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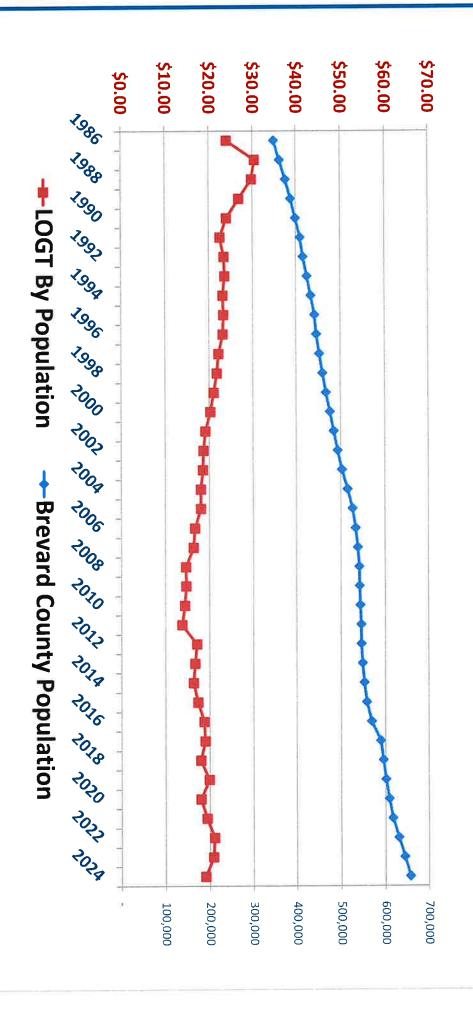
# Local Option Gas Tax Revenue 1986 - 2024





# LOGT Revenue Adjusted for Inflation 1986 - 2024

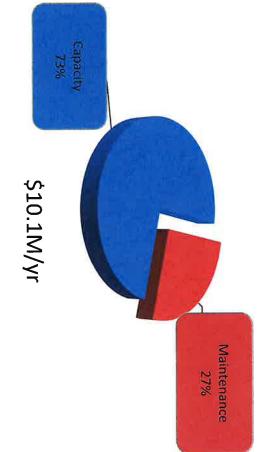

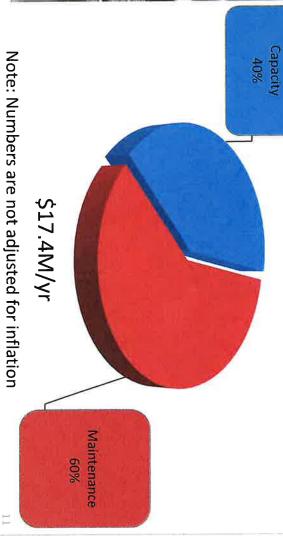
### Capacity Vs. Maintenance 2014 to 2017

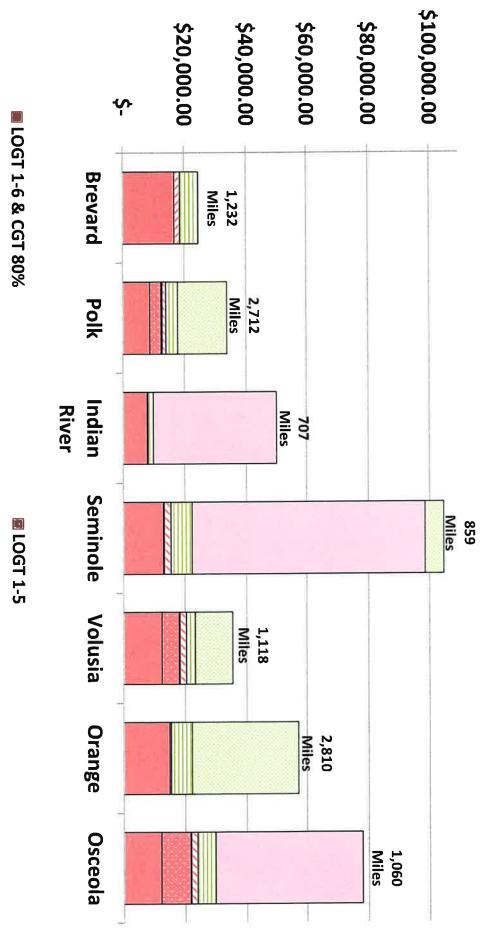






## Transportation Revenue Per Road Mile

### 10- & 20-Year Trend



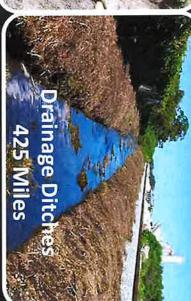


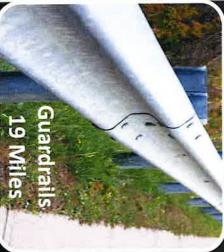




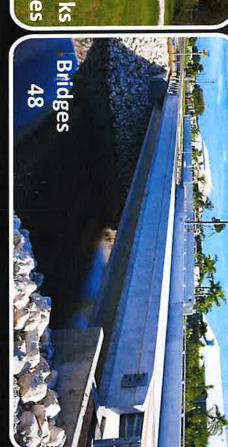




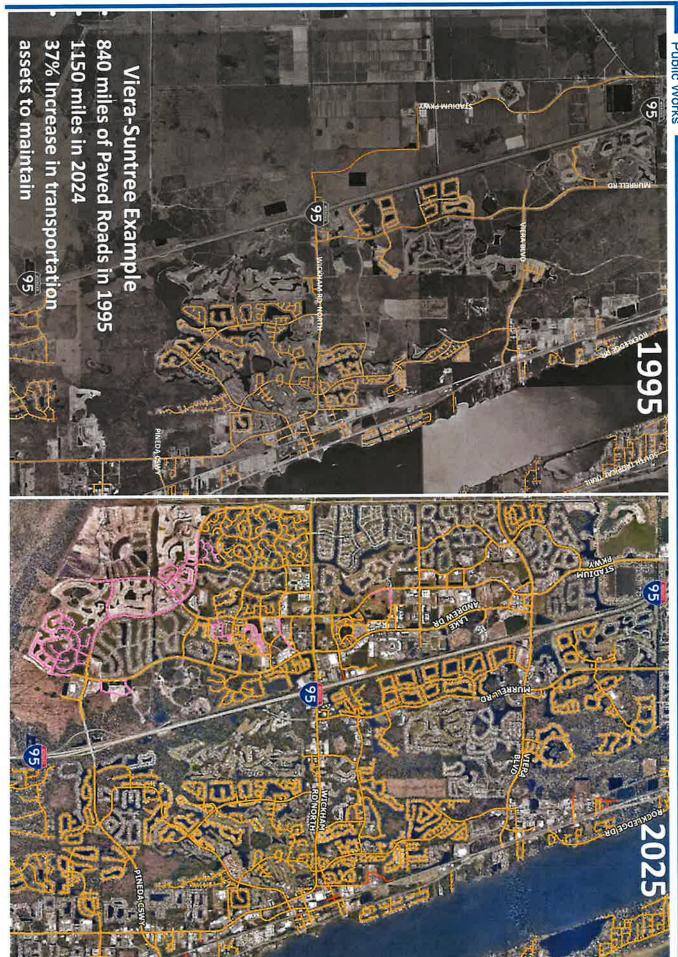








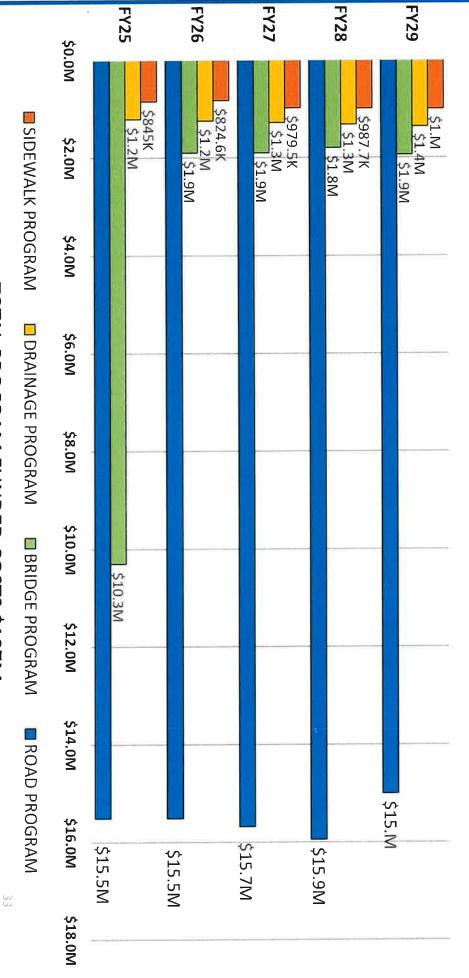






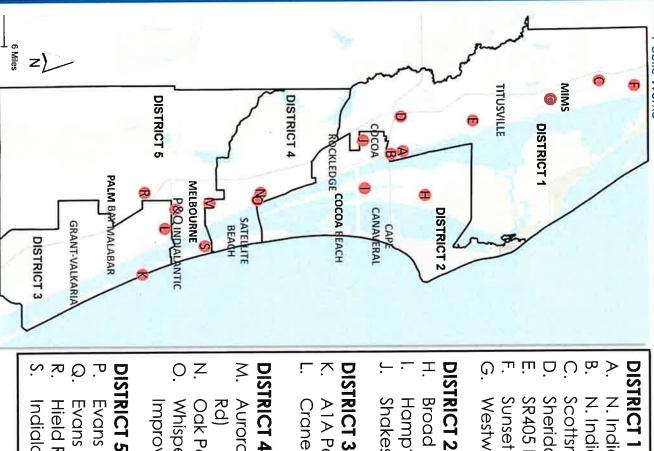

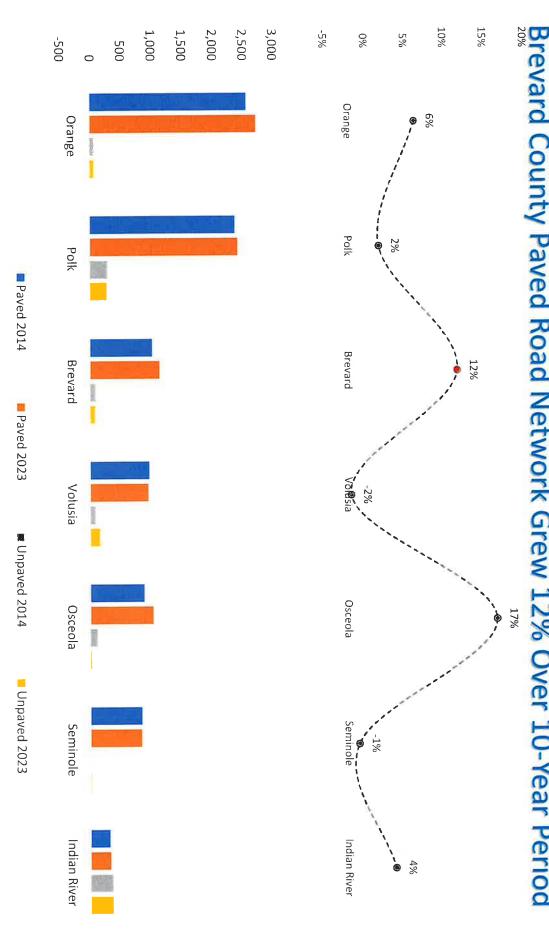

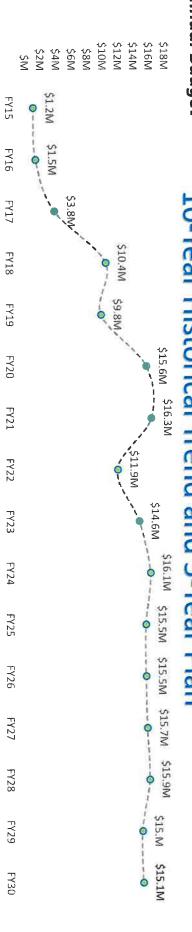

# 10-Year Historical Trend and 5-Year Plan



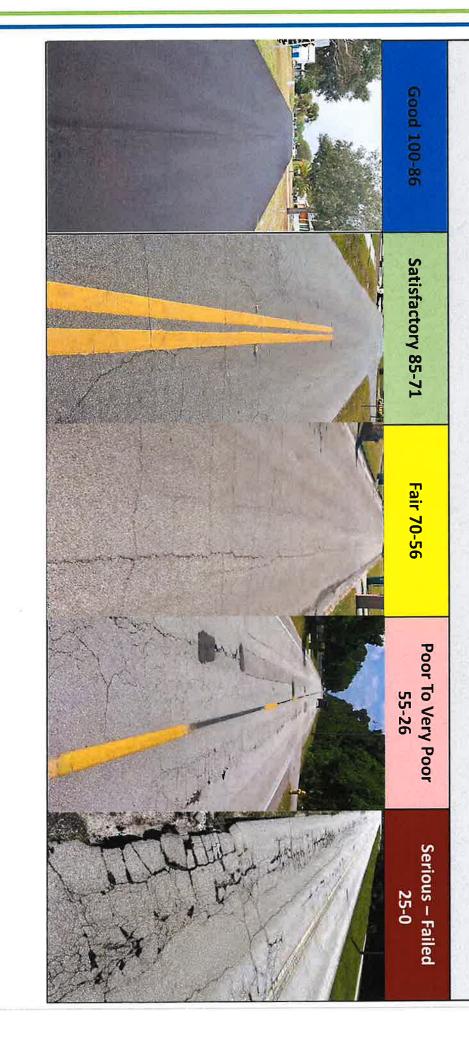

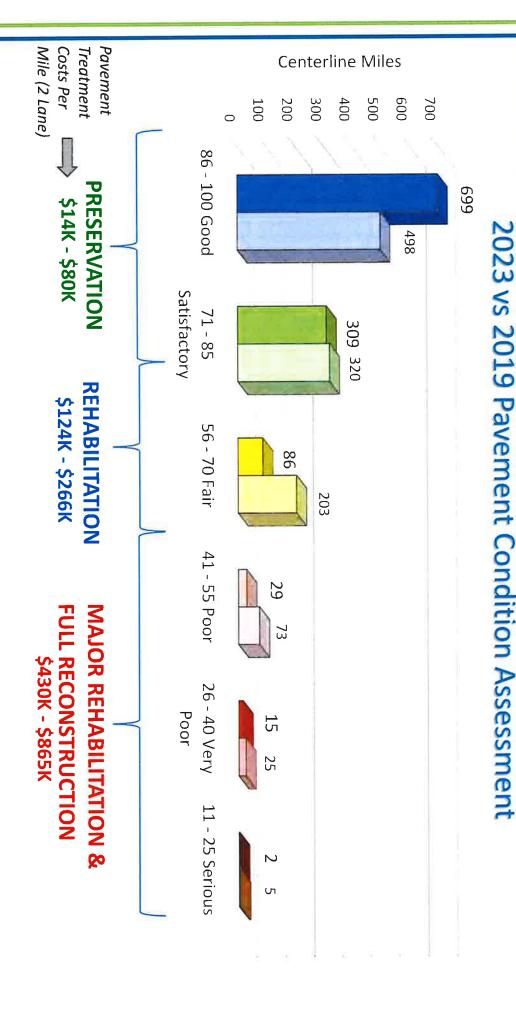

# **PCI SCORE (Pavement Condition Index)**





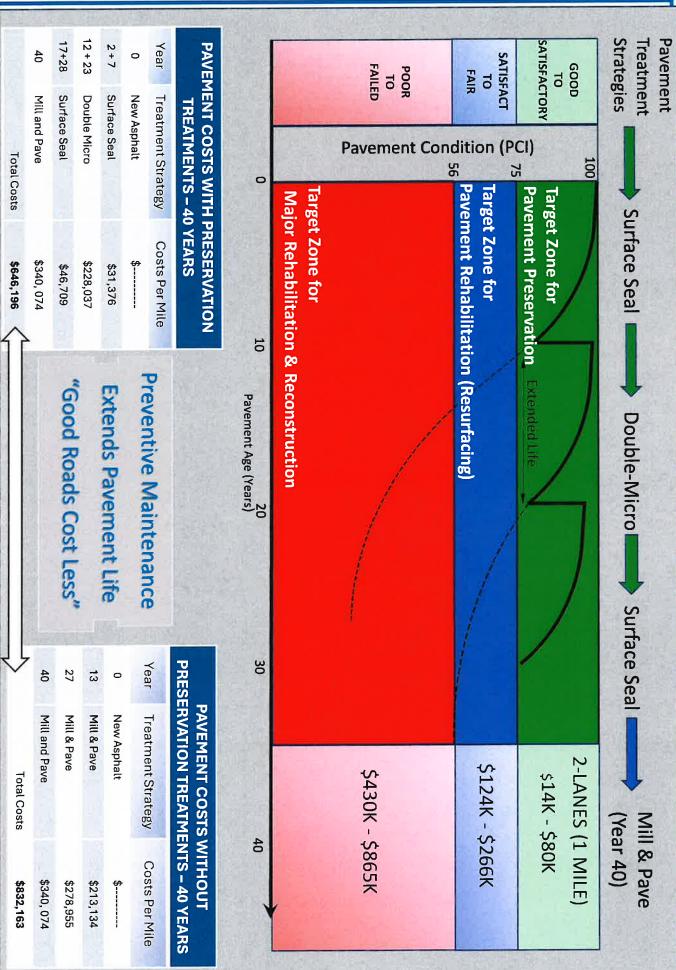

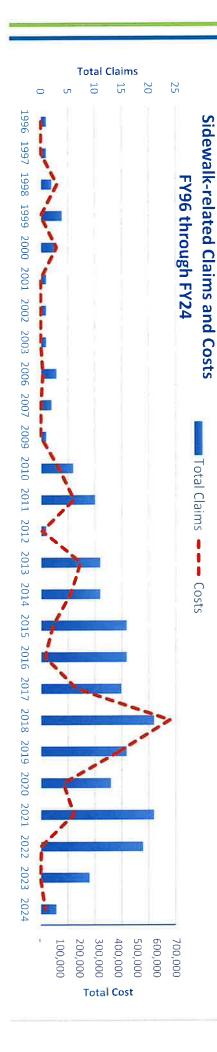

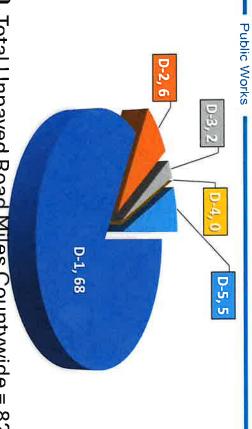

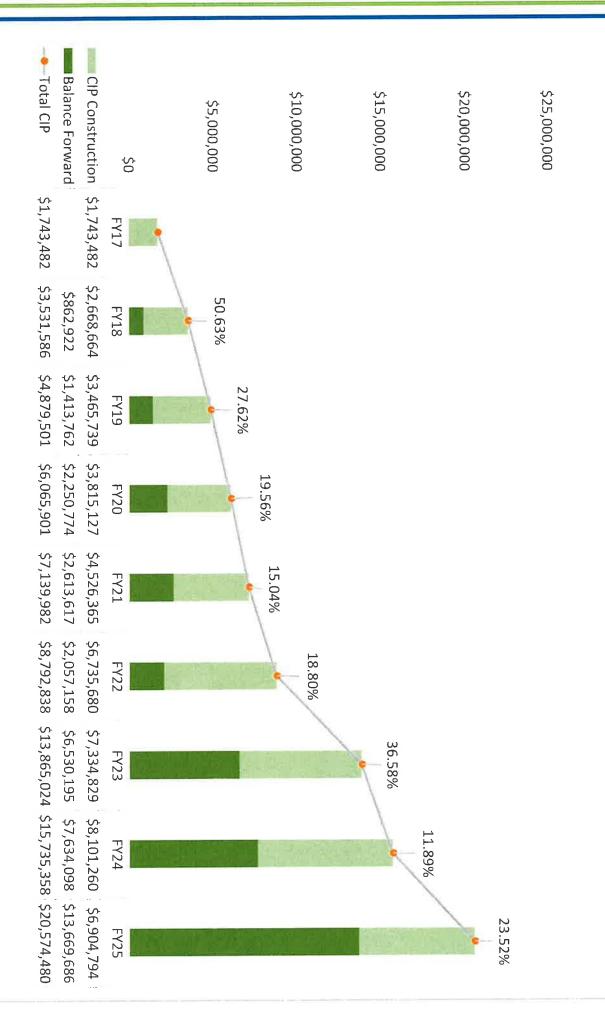
