Brevard County Shore Protection Project: Resolution and State Cost-Share Request

Requested Action:

It is requested that the Board of County Commissioners: 1) approve a resolution supporting the Brevard County Shore Protection Project; 2) request State grant cost-share funding, matched by local option tourist tax that is dedicated to the Beach Improvement Fund for shore protection projects; 3) authorize the County Manager or designee, with County Attorney, Risk Management and Purchasing Services approval, to execute contracts, amendments and task orders, as required and in excess of \$100,000, to secure state grant funds and accomplish work under state grants; and 4) authorize necessary budget change requests.

Summary Explanation and Background:

In order to assist local governments with the non-federal costs of restoring Florida's critically eroded beaches, the State Legislature provides matching grants to local governments. The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) ranks Local Government Funding Requests by using criteria adopted by the Florida Legislature.

On June 1st, the State released a call for submittals for the Beach Management Funding Assistance Program for FY22-23. To apply for the funds, a Local Government Funding Request must be accompanied by a supporting resolution. The resolution must be submitted by September 21, 2021. Project specific information will be compared by the FDEP to legislated criteria to determine Brevard County's rank and cost-share for receiving State matching funds in State FY22-23. The Board of County Commissioners last approved a similar 5 -year funding plan and Resolution on July 25, 2017.

Projects included in the attached State FY22-23 Funding Request Table include after the fact reimbursement of 20-21 construction expenses for the recently completed South Reach project, construction funding for the upcoming 22-23 renourishment of the Mid Reach project, as well as required engineering, monitoring and maintenance for the North, Mid and South Reaches of the Federal Shore Protection Project. Estimated costs for these activities to potentially be cost-shared through the FY22-23 request total \$12,358,803 including \$6,179,402 State and \$6,179,402 local funds. The required local match is committed in Tourist Development Council's Dedicated Beach Improvement Fund. The attached table also includes future (beyond FY22-23) project cost estimates as required by the State for future planning purposes, but these future funds are not

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being requested at this time. If Brevard's projects receive beach funds allocated by the Legislature for State FY22-23, FDEP grant agreements will be executed to secure funding.

According to a 2015 study completed by the Florida Department of Economic and Demographic Research, each \$1 invested by the State on beach restoration is responsible for generating a positive return on investment ROI of 5.4.

RESOLUTION NO. 2021 - 100

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING THE BREVARD COUNTY SHORE PROTECTION PROJECT AND REQUESTING STATE COST-SHARE FUNDING AS A MATCH FOR DEDICATED LOCAL FUNDS.

WHEREAS, a healthy beach and dune profile provides the best protection for upland properties and infrastructure during a severe storm event, provides sandy beaches for public recreation, and provides dry beaches and dunes for marine turtle nesting; and

WHEREAS, a 36.5-mile segment of Brevard County's shoreline, running south from Canaveral Inlet, has been identified by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Office of Beaches and Coastal Systems as a Critical Erosion Area pursuant to Florida Statutes Sections 161.101 and 161.161; and

WHEREAS, Brevard County, acting as local sponsor in a 50-year contract with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for the North and South Reaches, has placed beach quality sand along 9.5 miles of shoreline immediately south of Canaveral Inlet and 3.8 miles along the towns of Indialantic and Melbourne Beach, and has agreed to monitor and maintain both of these beaches located within the State's designated Critical Erosion Area; and

WHEREAS, Brevard County, acting as local sponsor in a separate 50-year contract with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, has placed beach quality sand along 7.8 miles of shoreline immediately south of Patrick Space Force Base in the Mid Reach portion of the Critical Erosion Area, and has agreed to serve as the local sponsor to monitor and maintain this beach; and

WHEREAS, Brevard County is required to monitor the physical performance of the restored beaches, the health and exposure of nearshore rock reefs and mitigation structures in the project areas, and marine turtle nesting success for at least three years subsequent to any nourishment activity; and

WHEREAS, Brevard County is in full support of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's Beach Management Funding Assistance Program and Local Government Funding Request process; and is committed to provide necessary local match; and

WHEREAS, Brevard County is desirous of cost-sharing with the State of Florida for the non-federal costs of restoring our beaches and monitoring their performance,

and has committed to the Army Corps of Engineers our ability to fund the local matching share of project costs for the duration of the 50-year contracts;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Brevard County Board of County Commissioners request state cost sharing as detailed in the County's Local Government Funding Request submitted to the Beach Management Funding Assistance Program administered by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's Office of Resilience and Coastal Protection.
