Spatial - Temporal Complexity


- 3 Waterbodies
- Mosquito River/Banana River/Indian River
- 156 mi long; Watershed (2,284 sq. miles)
- Surface waters (353 sq. miles)
- IRL-Halifax River boundary amendment extended project boundary 25 miles north (310 sq. miles of watershed)

Narrow – Shallow - Microtidal


- Micro-tidal; Wind-driven system
- Narrow/Shallow/Long Residence Time
- Poorly flushed 5 inlets to Atlantic Ocean
- Water flow constricted by causeways/NASA Crawlerway

Diverse Socio-Economics

- 7 counties in watershed/38 incorporated cities
- 1.6 million residents
- Population growth projections are high

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)

a.k.a Bipartisan Infrastructure Law
(BIL)

Congress appropriated \$132 million in funding for the 28 National Estuary Programs (NEPs) for fiscal years 2022 through 2026.

annually providing each with \$909,800 in Funding evenly distributed to the NEPs BIL funds.






