Requested Action:

It is requested that the Board of County Commissioners approve the changes and new review dates for County Policy BCC-54, Solicitation, Picketing, and Petitioning on County Property.

Summary Explanation & Background:

Per Sunset Review Policy BCC-31 Central Services and the County Attorney's Office reviewed Policy BCC-54 and made revisions for clarification of the objective, definitions, and directives. References were updated to reflect changes to the County's Code of Ordinances with regard to this policy. Changes are as follows:

IV. Directives, A. Restrictions

- Commercial solicitation is prohibited on County property except by permit (Note Section 78-107, Brevard County Code of Ordinances relating to Parks/Recreational facilities).
- Designated picketing zone maps are available for courthouses, government centers, and service complexes. Maps are attached as Exhibit A, available from the Facilities Department or can be downloaded from the BEACH (County intranet). All other County properties, picketing zones shall be designated by the property manager for each site (libraries, parks, senior centers, fire stations etc.). Specific areas of County property shall be designated by the Property Manager for solicitation, picketing and petitioning purposes. These areas will be available for expression to all individuals or groups. Only the Rules of Conduct set forth in Subsection (B) (2) of this policy shall apply to such activity on this property.
- Political candidates may walk through County buildings without disrupting the delivery of services to meet their constituents, as long they do not disrupt delivery of services to the public or interfere with personnel performing their work. However, per Florida Statute Chapter 106.15, no soliciting for campaign contributions is permitted in a building owned by a governmental entity.
- County employees may solicit on County property on behalf of non-profit entities (e.g., school fundraisers, walkathons, and bake sales) on their own time and without disruption of operations in the workplace. County employees are prohibited from soliciting, peddling or vending for individual or personal profit on County property, except on County approved methods.

IV. Directives, Standards and Procedures. Rules of Conduct: Solicitors, picketers and petitioners must:

I. Objective

Authorize non-commercial solicitation, picketing, and petitioning to ensure that all citizens are fully able to enjoy their constitutional rights to petition their government, and express their rights to freedom of speech in an orderly fashion without impairing or hampering County functions and services..

II. References

- A. Brevard County Code of Ordinance Chapter 2, Section 2-68(a)(7) – Establishes the authority to the County Manager to supervise the care and custody of County buildings and property.
- B. Brevard County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 62, Article IX, Section 62-3301, Signs.
- C. Brevard County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 78, Article III, Division 2, Section 78-107 – prohibits commercial activity in Parks/Recreational facilities except by permit.
- D. Chapter 125.01(1)(c), Florida Statutes – Vests power to the Board to provide and maintain County buildings.

III. Definitions

- A. "County property" is real property owned or leased by the County and under the operational control of the County.
- B. "Solicitation" means seeking support for a particular cause or point of view.
- C. "Petitioning" means the written or verbal solicitation or expression of a political, social, or religious viewpoint.
- D. "Picketing" means the display of placards or signs accompanied by vocal or pedestrian demonstrations, but does not include individuals holding hand-held signs.
- E. "Property Manager" means that person designated by the County Manager to manage the control and use of (all or the respective) County-owned property, i.e., the Central Services Department for multi-use facilities, and the "tenant" for single-use facilities.

IV. Directives

- A. Restrictions
 - 1. Commercial solicitation is prohibited on County property except by permit (Note Section 78-107, Brevard County Code of Ordinances relating to Parks/Recreational facilities).

2. Designated picketing zone maps are available for courthouses, government centers, and service complexes. Maps are attached as Exhibit A. All other County properties, picketing zones shall be designated by the property manager for each site (libraries, parks, senior centers, fire stations etc.). These areas will be available for expression to all individuals or groups. Only the Rules of Conduct set forth in Subsection (B)(2) of this policy shall apply to such activity on this property.
3. Nothing in this policy shall be construed to prohibit displaying signs (in a non-destructive manner) of a reasonable size at County property, except as outlined in Policy # BCC-55.
4. Political candidates may walk through County buildings to meet their constituents, as long they do not disrupt delivery of services to the public or interfere with personnel performing their work. However, per Florida Statute 106.15, no soliciting for campaign contributions is permitted in a building owned by a governmental entity.
5. Signage or other items may not be left unattended on the site (see Sign Ordinance). Unique signage in support of fund drives (United Way, etc.) may be approved on a case-by-case basis by the County Manager for the period of the drive.
6. County employees may solicit on County property on behalf of non-profit entities (e.g., school fundraisers, walkathons, and bake sales) on their own time and without disruption of operations in the workplace. County employees are prohibited from soliciting, peddling or vending for individual or personal profit on County property, except on County approved methods.

B. Standards and Procedures

1. Eligibility: Citizens, including not-for-profit groups and organizations, may solicit, picket, or petition on County-owned property for non-commercial purposes in areas designated by the Property Manager.
2. Rules of Conduct: Solicitors, picketers and petitioners must:
 - A. Keep the solicitation, picketing, or petitioning activity on designated areas and outside of buildings and parking lots, except for Commission meetings as outlined in Policy BCC-55.
 - B. Maintain their assigned area in an acceptable condition of orderliness and cleanliness, returning it to original condition when finished.
 - C. Conduct their activity in an orderly and peaceable manner which does not interfere with the normal activities of County government or other citizen's rights or interfere with access of the public or public employees to County facilities.
 - D. Conduct all activity during normal business hours or at such times as the County property is open to the public.
 - E. Remove all items after they are done, being sensitive that unattended items could be considered suspicious, and cause a potential security threat. Brevard County accepts no responsibility for items left on County property.


