

# Renewal of Solar PV Permitting Fee Exemption

#### SUBJECT:

Solar PV Permitting Fee Exemption

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

As of January 14th, 2019, since implementation of the exemption, the fiscal impact has been approximately \$42,200. The exemption was applied for about 226 permits. Of these, 225 were for residential installations. The average amount of exempt fees per permit was approximately \$187.

#### REQUESTED ACTION:

#### SUMMARY EXPLANATION and BACKGROUND:

On March 20th, 2018, during Regular Session, the Board of County Commissioners voted unanimously through resolution to implement a permitting fee exemption for solar photovoltaic installations. No other requirements were impacted. This exemption was for one year.

The attached resolution would extend the exemption.

## **RESOLUTION 19-**027

### **EXEMPTING SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC INSTALLATIONS FROM PERMITTING FEES**

**WHEREAS**, prior to implementing an exemption to permitting fees for solar photovoltaic installations, homeowners were charged an average of \$175 for such permits by Brevard County; and

**WHEREAS**, commercial entities were charged an average of \$400 for solar photovoltaic permits; and

**WHEREAS**, various groups and agencies, including the U.S. Energy Information Administration, a division of the U.S. Department of Energy, have concluded that solar photovoltaic power has a far less negative impact on the environment in comparison to traditional forms of power generation; and

**WHEREAS**, in many circumstances, it is in the economic long-term interests of residents and businesses to supplement or supplant traditional electric consumption with solar energy; and

**WHEREAS**, graduated permit fees are often perceived as an uncertain cost by those who might otherwise consider such installations, thereby discouraging further analysis of potential economic benefits; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interest of Brevard County citizens to remove barriers to the adoption and installation of solar photovoltaic equipment on homes and businesses; and

**WHEREAS**, for the foregoing reasons, the Brevard County Board of County Commissioners implemented an exemption to solar photovoltaic permitting fees on March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018, for a period of one (1) year; and

**WHEREAS**, this policy has led to a decreased burden on those considering such installations with minimal costs to the County, and have had no effect on the General Fund.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BREVARD COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, does hereby

AMEND Resolution 2018-039 to delete the scheduled sunset provision; all other permitting requirements shall remain unchanged.
