**REQUESTED ACTION:**

The County Charter was amended to include a provision for Citizen Recommendations for greater Efficiency and Effectiveness to come to the Board for definitive action. <b>Area/Dept Affected:</b>	Brevard County Jail / State Attorney
<b>Current Problem:</b>	The problem that I am seeing is that inmates in the Brevard county jail sitting with no information as to what they are being held on.. My husband Darnell Banks was arrested on July 14, 2017. Since that time he has not been spoken to by the Public Defender's office at all. They have appeared for him in court on 4 separate occasions.. A little background... He was arrested on July 14..went to Probable Cause hearing July 15. Remanded to custody July 18 was taken from his cell and processed on additional charges..appeared in court on July 19..again remanded.. Arraignment was cancelled and he was set for an early resolution hearing on Sept 28. Brought into court with no info, had not spoken to anyone prior, was offered 3 yrs in prison, he declined.. Sent back to jail and set for docket sounding on Nov 14. He was not allowed to attend, but his Public Defender whom he has not meet or spoken to was there and asked for a continuance and was granted..Next court date 1/30/2018. At this time he still has not spoken to any one and has requested that I request a bail hearing or an ROR hearing.. Any time that I have attempted to make contact with his Public Defender I was greeted with a rude receptionist.. I have never been able to speak to her but was able to at the hearing on Sept 28. She then informed me that his charges are being enhanced with a habitual offender enhancement even though the statue on this does not fit for Darnell. The only info that he has at this time is the info that I have been able to provide to him.. I believe that he is not receiving his constitutional rights as follows: He is being denied the ability to assist in his own defense.. He is being treated cruel and unusual as he does not have any official info from the court, also in his charges being enhanced with something that does not fit the accusations of the crimes committed
<b>Recommendation:</b>	My recommendation is that persons that are only accused of a crime or crimes still receive the protections under the constitution as a US citizen. He should have the benefit of speaking to the public defender that is assigned to him to assist with his defense. The Public at large should not have more information than the accused as what is going on with the case they are being charged.. If a lawyer is afforded to those that cannot afford lawyers then they should actually speak to their clients prior to EVER appearing in court on their behalf.

Recommendation Title: TECHNOLOGY LOCATING PIPE BLOCKAGES

Area/Dept Affected: Utility Services Department

Current Problem: We reside on Adamson Rd. and SHARE sewer line with the solid waste dump down the road. Adamson Creek is newly developed and completed with many more residential developments planned ON THIS ROAD. We have had continual blockage of the pipes since summertime. Dump residue crystallizes in the pipes and men and equipment are out here across from our house regularly; at all hours when alarm goes "critical". Pigging was finally done after months of this. This is very costly in man hours and without resolution

Recommendation: Why not use current technology that LOCATES blockages and manage the problem instead of continually failing to locate the true problem of the dump. Why is the dump on the sewer line for residential area? More homes are planned and this is BIG negative to our area!!! We should not be connected to the solid waste dump as residential users. The cost of aging pipes and blockages with manpower and flooding risk needs to be explored for a true solution.

**Staff Recommendations/Comments:**

The force main which supplies sewer service to the Adamson Creek subdivision has sufficient capacity to handle the demand. The developer of the subdivision connected to the Solid Waste force main because of the available capacity. Over a twenty year period, material has built up in the lines from the leachate being pumped from the landfill to the wastewater treatment plant. The lines were recently cleared and the Solid Waste Department is working with the Utility Services Department on a long term solution to prevent future build ups in the line.

We expect to complete our research and implement a long term maintenance solution in the next 45 days.

**March 28 2018 Update**

As a follow up to the above response, the Solid Waste Department completed their testing. On March 12, 2018 the Solid Waste Department issued a purchase order to Fog Free Technologies and started the use of a de-scaler to help prevent buildup in the line. The line was in use by only the landfill for over 20 years before the subdivision connected to the line. They were allowed to connect because there was capacity to handle the demand of the subdivision. The issues were discovered after the subdivision connected. This use of de-scaler by the Solid Waste Department should provide relief from these issues.

***Additional information on the product and the testing that was done:***

In order to alleviate the problem, Fog Free Technologies performed a series of jar tests using their Safe-Descaler product to dissolve material. The jar tests not only presented a solution to the problem, but also identified the correct strength and mix ratio to mix the product. The Safe-Descaler is shipped in concentrate and made to be mixed with water to correct concentration for the job at hand. The mix ratio for this application is 5:1 with water. This means that for every 55 gallon drum of product, we add about 250 gallons of water to make 300 gallons of usable material. The product is then pumped (at a startup rate of 12 gallons per day) into the wet well of the lift station just after the holding tank. This neutralizes the scale formation and prevents buildup in the pipe downstream.

II. STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS / COMMENTS

To the best of our knowledge, currently animal food bags are treated as part of the waste stream that is generated from the animal shelters is mixed with all the other

waste from the same site. This mixed waste is then combined with all the other waste that is collected along the same route. After the route is finished or the truck is full the waste is taken to either of our transfer stations or directly to the landfill at the Central Disposal Facility located in Cocoa. If the waste is taken to a transfer station the waste is then mixed with other waste to be consolidated into a transfer truck which transports it to the landfill in Cocoa.

For the Department to accomplish a program as described the animal food bags would have to be pulled from the waste through a method as used in a material recovery facility (MRF). This method entails the construction of a building that would house the equipment needed for this type of operation as well as building picking lines needed to sort the material. The cost would be well over \$3,000,000 which would not make it cost effective. You would also have to add the cost of operating the facility.

In order for a program of this type to work the material would have to be separated at the source, thus making it more effective.

**I. OBJECTIVE:**

To provide a process for Citizens as individuals or as an organized group of individuals to submit formal written recommendations for the enhancement of the effectiveness and efficiency of Brevard County Government.

**II. REFERENCE:**

A. Brevard County Home Rule Charter Section 2.9.10.


**III. DIRECTIVES**

- A. The County Manager, within this policy document, shall establish and recommend to the Board of County Commissioners a process and procedures whereby the Board can review and formally vote to accept, accept with revisions, or reject recommendations on the enhancement of the effectiveness and efficiency of County Government.
- B. An annual filing date with a review period shall be established for receipt of submission and final vote of the Board of County Commissioners.
- C. The County Manager will solicit, under this policy and process, recommendations that promote the efficiency and effectiveness of County government as the intent of the Charter amendment was not to address citizen grievances or specific citizen service requests.
- D. Any individual or organized group may submit recommendations intended to enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of County Government by submitting to the County Manager an electronic or hardcopy of the "Citizen Efficiency and Effectiveness" form attached to this policy. Upon submittal, the form will be reviewed and acted upon according to the following procedure.
  - 1. The annual filing date for submission shall be July 15, 2011 for the initial year and January 1 of each year thereafter.

2. The form will be available for download and submission on the County Internet Homepage. Hardcopies of the form will be available by request from the County Manager's Office.
3. Within forty five (45) days of receipt of the recommendation the County Manager's Office shall evaluate and comment upon the recommendation with a recommendation for the consideration of the Board of County Commissioners. If necessary the County Manager's Office will also forward the recommendation to the County Attorney for a review of the legality of the recommendation.
4. The County Manager after completion of the above referenced reviews will forward the recommendation and review package to the Board of County Commissioners for their review.
5. After forwarding the County Manager report to the Commission, the County Manager shall schedule an agenda item for the Board of County Commissioners to consider the citizen recommendation as is practical within the 120 day final vote requirement.
6. The County Manager will give the sponsor of the recommendation at least seven (7) days notice of the date, time and place of the meeting the recommendation is scheduled to be heard by the Board of County Commissioners.
7. The Board of County Commissioners must take a final vote to either approve, reject or revise and accept the recommendation within 120 days of the recommendation submittal date.
8. Under unusual or unforeseen circumstances, the Board of County Commissioners may waive any of the timing provisions relating to submittal, reporting or notice, as set forth in this policy with the exception of the 120 day final vote requirement specified in the Brevard County Home Rule Charter Section 2.9.10.
9. The County Manager will provide a electronic listing with disposition, via the County's webpage, of all recommendations.

#### **IV. RESERVATION OF AUTHORITY**

The authority to issue and/or revise this policy is reserved for the Board of County Commissioners.
